Tom writes ...

One of the perks of being married to the Director of the Leeds Church Institute is that you get to meet all the guest speakers at the Hook Lecture over a meal beforehand.

Over the years I have got to meet Frances Young, Giles Fraser, Sara Maitland, Bikhu Parekh and Jonathan Bartley. This year I am already looking forward to meeting Canon Mark Oakley who is coming to speak at Leeds Minister on 27 September.

For an indication of how good he is as a speaker why not listen to the sermon he preached at the ordination of deacons at St Edmundsbury cathedral this year: a masterclass of how to inspire people in less than 8 minutes (on the cathedral website under "sermons").

Helen has written a book review of Canon Oakley's latest book *The Splash of Words* in this month's review (page 23). In it he makes the point that poetry is life-giving for *all* of us. Or, as the current ABC Justin Welby puts it, "poetry is vital for all Christians ... it helps us grow in faith, hope and love."

Helen is kindly taking on the library at St Giles from Sue Grahame. The library, kept in the Church Hall, is a wonderful but unquestionably underused resource which Sue has built up over many years into a veritable treasure trove of spiritual resourcing.

Nick Pinches mentions in this month's Churchwardens Blog his own gratitude to Sue (and indeed John) for all they have done over they years and I would like to express my own. This Church is greatly in their debt for all they have done behind the scenes to enable our flourishing in Christ.

Roger the Methodist minister and myself now meet regularly and have discovered that we share a love of poetry. Hence the reason for this year's Advent course, an opportunity to look at particular poems as we journey through Advent together (for further details please see page 23).

I was delighted to come across a copy of Janet Morley's poetry anthology "Haphazard by Starlight" (from the last line of U. A. Fanthorpe's Christmas poem BC:AD) in the Church library. We intend to get a number of copies of the book available for people to buy or borrow from the start of November.

### Harvest interview with Jill Perkin

Have you been involved in farming all your life?

Yes, I was born on Stubbings Farm, on Leeds Road. My father was a farmer of 100 acres. I belonged to the Young Farmers and met my future husband, Richard at a Farmer's Ball in Otley. When we married Richard bought the farm from my father and continued to farm it though we lived in the house by Golden Acre. Richard also came from farming stock, being born at High Barn Farm in Adel.

### What type of farming?

We found my father's milking herd too restrictive so we acquired a beef herd, sheep and suckling cows. Richard also grew Christmas trees and provided the church with one every year.

### Has it been a fulfilling life?

Oh yes! I always loved being outside with Dad, even when my Mother tried to dissuade me. At the age of 9 years, I was riding on the back of the tractor once, Dad lifted the back up and I managed to get my foot crushed but it didn't put me off.

# Do children today understand about farming?

Farming has changed a lot over the years. To make a living from farming the farm has to be big so the smaller farmers have to diversify. Children's farms are ideal to teach them that milk just doesn't come from Asda! We used to have the local primary schools visit

and Richard loved explaining it all to them.



How has your faith played a

part in your life as a farmer's wife?

I've always gone to church so I wouldn't know any different. I used to run the Sunday School in Otley when Canon Clayton was there. My Grandma used to live in the Cemetery Lodge (now demolished) on Moor Road so I used to pick her up, then my mother and go with them to the Mothers' Union at St Giles.


#### What were the worst times?

The weather. The winds and the rain. The water would run off the Chevin and I remember when it took out walls and fences ... just like what happened in North Yorkshire this summer. There was also the time when Richard came off his horse and broke his femur. He was in hospital for 14 weeks and I had to milk the cows!

### What were the highlights?

Definitely hay time. We loved bringing the hay in and riding on the cart horses. It was also around my birthday and I remember sitting out in the garden round the 'Pig Plonk' (a large table that they used to slaughter the pigs on) having my birthday party.

# **Carry on Champing**



Guess how many churches the Church of England has to maintain? 4000? 7000? 10,000? In fact the Church of England is responsible for 16,000

church buildings, 12,500 of which are listed buildings. And with the overall decline in congregations and subsequent lack of income (just ask Bernard), it is increasingly difficult to maintain some of these tiny parish churches.

Some become redundant churches and many end up in the care of the Churches Conservation Trust (CCT), a charity raising money to repair and find a use for these ancient buildings. Some of these uses are very imaginative. St Paul's Church in Bristol has been transformed into an open space for filming, conferences, hot air balloon testing, and exhibitions of circus skills!

The tiny St John's in Blawith was transformed into living space for local people. The CCT project at All Saints in Langport in Somerset is now a project run by young people to provide new opportunities and skills.

Another CCT initiative is champing, i.e. camping in a church (a bit like glamping only without the yurts). They persuade some idiots to pay good money to go and stay in a very old church with no water or power in the middle of a graveyard, and to sleep on camp beds in the nave.



Well, myself and another idiot spent two nights champing in St Leonard's Church, Old Langho, Lancashire in July. It was during that very hot spell and the cool, if rather dusty, church was very welcoming! Tea, coffee, bottled water and camp beds were provided, with torches and lamps. We won't discuss the loo.

We had two very peaceful and enjoyable days and nights. 'Our' church, as we came to call it, was built in the 1550s but the building materials came from the nearby Whalley Abbey, a 13<sup>th</sup> century Cistercian abbey dissolved by Thomas Cromwell in the 1530s.

## **PCC Update**

Tom chaired a meeting of the PCC on 10 September 2019.

Church finances were as always a particular concern. Members of the PCC are trustees of the charity (ie St Giles' church) and their first concern is for the future of the church and the importance of managing and preserving our financial resources. It was decided not to draw on any financial reserves to pay the parish share this year. The PCC are delighted that Elizabeth Johnson has agreed to be our Safeguarding Officer. Liz will be known to most of you and her professional background and commitment will be invaluable to the church in this important role.

The PCC discussed a paper presented by Bernard Williams entitled 'Responding to Change'. Bernard laid out imaginative ideas to encourage the growth of the church in the changed circumstances we are in with a part time instead of full time vicar. Circumstances will inevitably mean a greater involvement by the laity. Bernard outlined five areas of concern ie Outreach, Communications, Worship, Pastoral Care and Work with Children. The PCC appointed chairs to lead these five working groups, and will consider reports from them at the next PCC meeting in November. Please think if any of these are areas where you would like to help and look out for the tap on your shoulder!

The PCC were sorry to bid farewell to John Grahame. Sue and he will be 'emigrating' (to Wales!) very soon. John has given service to the PCC for about 20 years in all, and St Giles has benefitted from his thoughtful and careful advice. We wish them well in their new abode.


### The Splash of Words. Believing in Poetry

Mark Oakley (Canterbury Press, 2017)

The book starts well, so don't skip the introduction to get to the 'main event' of the poems. Mark Oakley makes the case for more poetry in our lives. He points

to the way in which poetry evokes a spiritual response, using language to hint at greater truths than those that fit neatly into everyday facts and figures. The business of religion too: poetry and faith are complementary.

Having encouraged us to read poetry (even if we find it hard work) the book then reflects on a range of old and new poetry, one poem in each chapter. In his reflections Oakley explores the spiritual and emotional depths of the poems. In this way he helps the reader to spend time with each poem and gain a deeper understanding.




This book is highly recommended and was recently awarded the 2019 Michael Ramsey Prize for Theological Writing. Awarding the prize, Archbishop Justin Welby said: "This book will bring poetry alive to anyone who reads it and shows us how vital poetry is for all Christians – rather than an elite activity. Reading poetry alone and together will help us grow in faith, hope and love."
