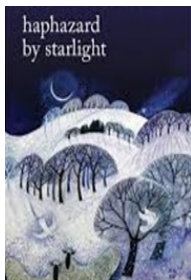

The Old Vicarage

THERE'S a house near the bottom of Church Hill called 'The Old Vicarage' and I have often heard it said that it has never been a Vicarage. This seemed strange as it was so close to St Giles, so I decided to do some 'digging'. The house dates back to



approx 1700, similar to the Old Manor Farm opposite and sometime between 1911 and 1939 North Gate, Bramhope became Church Hill. Research has (eventually!) shown that Theophilus Robert Bruce lived in the Vicarage on Northgate, Bramhope in 1891. Theophilus was born in Ipswich, Suffolk in 1827 and when he lived in Bramhope he had a housekeeper, Miss Ann Bulmer, a 63 year old spinster and a servant, Miss

Jane Featherstone who was 23. Why is this relevant? T R Bruce was the first Incumbent of St Giles (1881-1892) and the last curate of the Puritan Chapel.

Ten years later, in the 1901 Census, Mr & Mrs James Wade were living in The Old Vicarage, North Gate. James Wade was a Solicitor and he and his wife Elizabeth J, had a son James who was born in 1895. They too had a servant, Annie Deighton, who was 16. Once again ownership changed hands and in 1911 Charles and Lavinia Dobson were living in the Old Vicarage on Northgate. They had two children, William A (b 1899) and Hilda May (b1904) plus Charles's mother, Mary living with them. Charles was a Drapery Salesman and had moved, with his wife, mother and son, from Barnstead Terrace, Potter Newton between 1901 and 1904. Their daughter was born at the Vicarage. Charles had done well for himself and by 1939 (in the WW2 Register) he was a buyer of linen cottons and a carpet and linoleum wholesaler. However he was now married to Martha and they had a further 2 children, Betty (b. 1916) and Joan (b. 1925). Approximately 25 years later

Dementia. Living in the Memories of God

by John Swinton (SCM Press 2012)

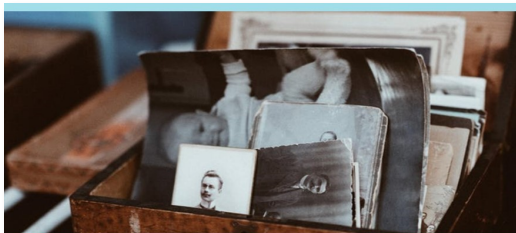

THIS book describes a distinctively Christian understanding of dementia saying that using only a medical model is insufficient for pastoral care and faith community life.

Beginning with God, not neurology, gives us a different perspective. For example, God doesn't have a brain yet we believe the words of Isaiah 49: 15-16 'I will not forget you! See I have engraved you on the palms of my hands'. So, God's memory isn't simply about a brain remembering facts but rather it exists outside time, it is about relationship and redemption.

And so too for human memory. This isn't just in our heads, but our hearts and relationships too. Other people help us to remember things all the time, and our emotions and other senses such as smell make powerful memories. This leads to hope in the midst of deep forgetfulness. Swinton encourages us that as a church of remembering friends, with the remembrance of the Eucharist at the heart of our life together, each of us can truly encounter one another and God. It is a long book and challenging to read, but inspiring. As well as offering a practical theology of dementia, it is essentially about our shared Christian discipleship.

there were new residents at The Old Vicarage, a Mr & Mrs North. These were the parents of Tony North who sings in St Giles' choir today. Further ownership research of the 'Old Vicarage' will have to wait until 2021 when the next census is released but I have one further fact to reveal. Charles and Lavinia Dobson's son William A, is remembered on Bramhope's war memorial. He died in Barry Military Hospital, during WW1.

Our current records of births marriages and deaths and the PCC minutes are looked after by the Churchwardens and the PCC Secretary.

There is also a small collection of newspaper cuttings and other documents relating to St. Giles. My main role has been to look after the Church Library. Matthew Dagg, my father, used his PhD in Physics to begin an unusual career in the soil science of tropical agriculture which gave my two sisters and myself an exciting expat upbringing, culminating in school in Harrogate. I grew up in a Christian Home

Childhood involved multiple showings of 'The Miracle Maker' and tugging on your mum's sleeve every week after her 'final' post-church coffee... Mine was a typical Christian upbringing. My parents loved God, my dad was a Vicar, we prayed before meals, and did devotionals before bed. Alongside family dog walks, scribbling in notebooks, wrestling with my siblings over Pokémon cards, and, of course, going to school – that was my life for about eighteen years.

And now here I am, mid-twenties, claiming to love Jesus for myself. I know what you might be thinking – is my faith just a result of my cultural upbringing? Was I brainwashed? No. God opened my eyes, I saw the horror of my sin, the beauty of the cross, and asked Him to save me. Now I know Him as Father, and He calls me His child (1 John 3:1).

I was a reluctant church-goer. I followed mum's mad dash to the front pew every Sunday with minimal enthusiasm. I was never that eager kid raring to go to every youth group,

church weekend away, or climb up Salisbury hill on Good Friday. I'd rather be in my own world at home. My twin sister, Milla, and I didn't have anyone our own age at church, and the fact that church wasn't an enjoyable social club could have meant that I lost interest in all things Christian – but I didn't. And that's mostly because of my parents.

The thing that had the biggest impact on my growing person was,

quite simply, them. They were consistent in going to church, consistent in reading the Bible and praying before bed, consistent in their forgiving love towards each other and their four 'defiant' children (mum's word, not mine). I saw Jesus in the routine of their everyday lives (Ephesians 5:1-2). They made outward choices of helping people, even the way they disciplined us was impactful – one time, after I lied, I distinctly remember my Dad and I sitting on the kitchen floor, my

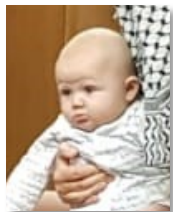
