Hello Everyone

We have a lovely new home and most of the rooms are nearly as we want them, with just the spare room and garage packed high with packing boxes. I am already feeling happy here and enjoying this lively village community and friendly Church family.

Lent Course 2019

The Lent Course for 2019 is *"Receiving Christ in Five Different Ways"*. It is written by Canon John Young who worked for two Archbishops of York. The accompanying CD has contributions by:

- Rt Revd Nick Baines – the Bishop of Leeds,
- Margaret Sentamu – independent diversity and leadership development consultant,
- Revd Ken Howcroft – former President of the Methodist Conference,
- Theodora Hawksley – RC Sister at the Bar Convent, York.

The course starts in early March (see page 13 for dates) and the dates are included as part of this article. Afternoon and evening sessions are being offered to cater for people's preferences.

The course will be run 'Café Style' following the success of the course last year. It is split into 5 sessions.

The format of each session will be an introduction by the group leader, listening to the CD clip and finally the discussion. This will be around pre-set questions and working in small groups of around 3-5 people. Each group will manage their own discussion and there will be no feedback to the whole group. This is to provide an informal and relaxed approach.

There will be plenty of tea, coffee and sweet treats available.

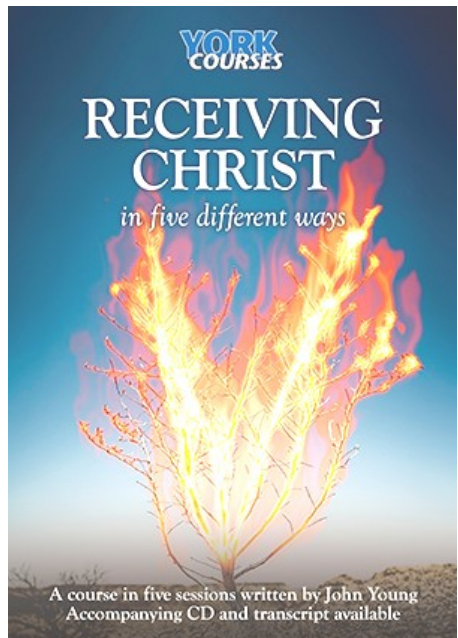
The five sessions are as follows:

- Session 3 - Receiving Christ: in Holy Communion,

Here is one of the readings for the Saturday in Holy Week. It seems to me appropriate for these uncertain times.

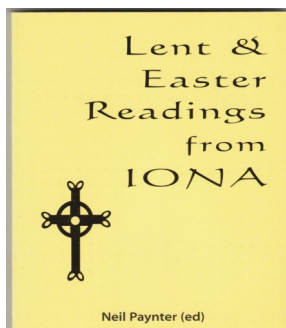
