Hello Everyone

I have been showing greater restraint in my Lenten disciplines, trying not to overanticipate Easter. Alcohol consumption is down and my trip to the pub on Sunday was for a baptism party, strictly business not pleasure. So is chocolate consumption, with the eating of Easter eggs, even the Cadburys cream egg kind, off the snack menu.



David Kirby Memorial service April 4, 2019

Margaret asked Fred Archenhold to talk about David's involvement with St Giles', the Parish church of Bramhope and his commitment to the local Historical Society. Unfortunately Fred could not be with at the service and he has asked Nick Pinches to deliver his words.

Fred writes:

David and Margaret's arrival in the village of Bramhope in 2004 coincided with a vacancy at St Giles. It is not difficult to imagine what happened next! David began to make, and continued to make for the next 14 years, an invaluable contribution to the spiritual life of St Giles. Those of us who worshipped at St Giles were privileged to have him in our midst.

Many of us in the congregation found, either in private discussions with David or listening to his sermons, that the ideas underpinning the spiritual basis of his churchmanship resonated with ours and helped us to think more deeply about the nature of faith.

During his 14 years' association with St Giles, David gave his unstinting support to the resident vicar, or, during vacancies, the churchwardens, by taking services, weddings, baptisms and funerals, as well as providing pastoral care.

David was a popular speaker at Bramhope Historical Society. He and Margaret travelled from Pocklington only a few months ago to give an illustrated talk about their recent exploration of Armenia.



One of the 9 presentations David made, on a variety of topics, was on 'Holy Wells'. In passing he mentioned that many 'holy' wells are named after Helena, the mother of Constantine the Great, the first Roman emperor to become a Christian. We then remembered that a local caravan park within the parish of Bramhope is named 'St Helena's Caravan Park'. So David and I. led by his Labrador Damson, set out with a map to try and find a 'well' within the grounds of the caravan park. I am pleased to say that we did eventually find some water in a broken stone structure hidden in some undergrowth. We both gave full credit to Damson for sniffing it out first!

Nick then spoke about David at the Rotary Club of Headingley.

It wasn't too long after David arrived in the village before he was asked to become one of the 1.3 million Rotarians in the world. In true 'David' fashion he didn't just join – he got involved; really involved. Members quickly came to know him and soon recognised his exceptional intellect,

a talent that many tried to take advantage of by somehow manoeuvring themselves onto the same quiz team as him.

Having learnt about his time of ministry in the Algarve as well as his other overseas 'forays', he soon became Chair of the club's International Committee which aims to capitalise on Rotary's world-wide reach. In the headlines recently, due to the Mozambique Cyclone disaster, is Shelter Box. Rotary is a major partner with this Charity, which for a cost of about £600 provides to those in desperate short-term need. A single box contains a family sized tent, cooking utensils, and other items essential for survival, and tools to start rebuilding a home. This is one of the two charities that Margaret has chosen to share the proceeds of today's retiring collection

The club considers the International aspect of Rotary a reason to explore other cultures and just 11 months ago David led us on a wonderful 'International' 3-day trip to Gdansk on the Baltic coast of Poland. Many members here today will remember this international visit as being 'one of the best'.

As mentioned earlier, David was always willing, when asked, to give a talk on a topic of interest. Despite his professional speciality being geography, he nearly always chose an historical matter to challenge members. I particularly remember the title of one of his talks "The Brussen Men of Elmete" which took us back into the Dark Ages of English history. David became President of the club for a year in 2012. He took on the challenge

with his usual vigour, and during his time in office he started the club's support for Leeds Foodbanks which were in the process of being set up. It wasn't long before he and Margaret took on the regular commitment of running a Foodbank outlet centre in the Harehills district of Leeds and arranging the collection of food donated by club members. This, they continued until they moved here last autumn. Hence the Leeds South and East Foodbanks is the second charity that Margaret has chosen.

David took every opportunity to join in the everyday life of Bramhope and the surrounding area. In addition to his interests and activities afore mentioned, he loved singing with the Otley Choral Society, and I understand he had just taken steps to join a similar group here in Pocklington. He loved taking Damson for walks and he enjoyed visits to the theatre with Margaret, both indoors and out. The photo on the back of the service sheet was taken at an outdoor performance of Kinren in Bishop Auckland. It wasn't a balmy summer's evening!


Finally, David was a great friend of many people. He was good company and warmed our hearts with his relaxed conviviality, quick wit and wise counsel.
