### From the Vicarage

#### The humble bicycle

One of the most imaginative passion plays I have participated in was *The Headingley Hero* by local Leeds playwright and author, Dan Ingram-Brown. This collaboration about ten years ago by Headingley Churches Together began with a 'triumphal procession' down the drive of my former parish, St Chad's, Far Headingley, with Jesus on a bicycle riding between a row of cars with bonnets raised and beeping their horns.

We catch up with Jesus railing against politicians and people of power at the St Chad's War memorial. This has swift repercussions when he is arrested outside Kentucky Fried Chicken and taken to be tried outside St Michael's Church. Jesus is then crucified in the rose garden outside the Arc, then his body carried unceremoniously off wrapped in a sheet... Given that the passion play was a Good Friday, we were only given a hint of the resurrection at the end.

If Jesus came back today what mode of transport would he favour? Probably nothing beats walking for itinerant ministry and the opportunities for genuine face-to-face encounters with people. I wonder, however, if the humble bicycle in a procession (maybe not one with thirty gears that costs as much as a brand new car) might be the modern day equivalent of a donkey.






