From the vicarage

IN the last edition of the magazine we had an article from the diocese about the vision of the diocese which has the strapline Loving, Living and Learning.

I am going to be looking at Loving, Living and Learning over the coming months but what better month than April to reflect on love, when we have Easter.

Easter is a time of celebration that Jesus died and rose again, that God saved Him from death and through Him saved us from death too. And all this is based on the love of God for us His people, demonstrated through His Son Jesus Christ; the love of our Lord Jesus who gave His life as a sacrifice not just for his followers, not just for the Jewish people but everyone including those who had nailed him to the cross.

'Forgive them Father for they do not know what they are doing.' Luke 23 verse 34.

And in the face of such forgiveness, if we are followers of Jesus then we have to copy that attitude of forgiveness even where 'they do not know what they are doing'. Hard to do I know in this litigious and self righteous world we live in.

And as Christians we live in the world, are of the world, but live to God's standards, not our own or anyone else's. Our measurement of how we live up to God's call is not on the world's measure but God's. So we need to ask ourselves:

Do we really love God?

Which commandment is the greatest?

Jesus replied: *'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.'* (Matthew 22:37)

Do we really love our neighbour?

And the second (greatest) is like it: *'Love your neighbour as yourself.'* (Matthew 22:39)

And do we really love each other?

³⁴ *'A new command I give you: love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another.'* ³⁵ *By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.'* (John 13:34-35)

Lent has been a time of reflection on our faith and our discipleship; Lent leads up to Easter, a celebration of the greatest love ever shown. Jesus gives the highest of standards to follow that we love each other, not only lip service, not only to those we like, not only to those who love us, as disciples of our Lord we have to demonstrate that with actions, just as Jesus did. Easter Blessings and Love to you all.

CIRCLE DANCING

OUR group felt very privileged to be invited to be part of the Women's World Day of Prayer, which this year was held at the Methodist Church on Friday March 3. The Service had been composed by the people of the Philippine Islands.

Singing and dancing were an integral part of the service. We chose a dance from the South Pacific Islands called "The Blessing" which blesses the boat and the people who are about to set off across the sea. The simple hand movements are expressing the hope that the sea will remain smooth and calm, and that the sun and moon will guide them on their journey. Also that the ocean currents will move in their direction, and finally that they will safely reach dry land. The entire congregation could join in from their seats, and judging by their faces, thoroughly enjoyed being able to participate.

We loved the idea of people all over the world taking part in the same service with the same words. It was like a Mexican Wave, beginning as the sun rose in the extreme Eastern countries, and hour by hour spreading round the world. 170 countries and islands took part,

all praying for the people of the Philippines. In the UK at least 6000 services were held.

About 100 million live in the Philippine Islands. They have a high incidence of typhoons and earthquakes, as they are located in the Pacific Ring of Fire, close to the Equator. They are still struggling to recover from Typhoon Haiyan which hit the islands in Nov.'13. It was the most severe storm ever recorded to hit land. They certainly deserve our prayers.

We are now looking forward to next year's WWDP, and wonder if it will be appropriate for us to join in with a dance again.

From the library shelf...

I DON'T know if anyone has read the book I wrote about last month – 'Dethroning Mammon' by Justin Welby, the Archbishop of Canterbury. I am hoping that someone has and I would be very interested to hear what you think of it – why not write a short review?

There are a number of books in the library dealing with Lent and Easter. Close as we are to Easter it's still not too late to do some reading for Lent, a good and positive way to make sure that we keep in touch with the real meaning of Easter, and not just with the chocolate and Easter bunnies. Not that we can't enjoy these as well, but it is so easy to forget that Lent is a time for reflection, and that the central point of Easter is the Cross followed by the Resurrection of Christ.

But I know how busy everyone is, how difficult it is to find time to read. So this month's book is one where you only need to spend 5 or 10 minutes – the time it takes to a page or two. 'Lent and Easter Readings from Iona' edited by Neil Paynter, is an anthology of prayers and readings, the latter based on short passages from the Bible. The contributors to the book are members of the Iona Community.

The Island of Iona is said to be the site of a monastery founded in 563 by Saint Columba. The monastery flourished in the middle ages, and became a centre of Christian worship and learning. Later, the abbey fell into ruin, until in 1938 George McLeod founded the Iona Community, an ecumenical Christian community, and the abbey was rebuilt. Their website is well worth a visit: <https://iona.org.uk/about-us/> Iona is now a place of pilgrimage and retreat

for many visitors each year. I visited it some years ago and found a place of peace and great tranquillity; a truly holy place.

In this book there are readings for all the Sundays in Lent and then for each day in Holy Week.

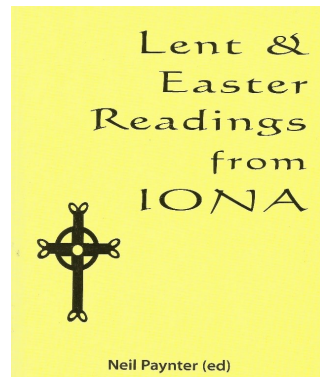
Here is an example:

economic migrants, forsooth! (But Theresa May was still at school). There followed the births of our second daughter, and then our first son, born in Scarborough and Whitby.

The closure of the Marine Lab meant a move to Leeds, where John took up a lectureship in Zoology and continued his research on evolution. This is how we came to Bramhope in 1982, and became members of St Giles Church. Our second son was born in Leeds. The children went to Bramhope Primary (take a bow, Mary!) and finished their school education at Prince Henry's; both schools did them very well, fitting them to fly the nest to universities in Sheffield and Manchester.

SUE was born in Rotherham, and went to school there and at Lowther College in Denbighshire. She went to Sheffield for a first degree in Botany, and then to what is now the School of Ocean Sciences (University of Wales, Bangor) for a PhD. John was born in Jamaica, going to school and university there, and thence to the School of Ocean Sciences also for a PhD ... (so, the rest is history, as they say).

That history – we married in Jamaica, in St James Parish Church where John's parents were married, and where he was christened. For a few years we worked in Jamaica, both on the 'Kingston Harbour Project' addressing the issue of pollution in a tropical harbour. Our first child was born there, and christened in St James PC. Then an opportunity came to move to Leeds – actually to Robin Hood's Bay where Leeds University had a marine laboratory –

John continued teaching and researching at Leeds University until retirement not too long ago, while Sue has had a more varied career – she enjoyed being a full time mum for some years and then later balanced most of the family care with jobs in Leeds Libraries (e.g. writing content for the 'Discovering Leeds' website (<http://www.leodis.net/discovery/>) and in the University, in the Centre for Bioscience and the School of Geography. Sue is also now retired.

Both have been (and John still is) PCC members here and Sue looks after the St. Giles Church Library. Both have been involved with Christian Aid; John is on Deanery Synod and is joint Safety Officer. We've received much from the Church here: in particular we are grateful for the support of the Healing Prayer Group at a time of seemingly intractable problems.
