

So is there such a thing as an ideal marriage? Ruth Graham wife of Billy Graham said the following 'A good marriage is the union of two forgivers'. Certainly a short memory is required.

Keith and I recently celebrated our ruby wedding (40 years) and by experience we can say that there is no perfect marriage only those where there is a will to journey together through life's ups and downs.





Book Review: Prayers, Texts & Tears: A creative response to grief



What happens when your whole world is shattered by the death of someone you love?

For spoken word artist Dai Woolridge, losing his dad to cancer left him lost for words. This book is a raw

and honest account of grief; using stories, psalm like prayers and sometimes humour, Dai offers a creative responsive to God.

He says "In this book I wanted as much as possible to bare my soul. To prise it open and show you what's inside: the faith bits, the gritty bits and the tough bits. It is a book for those who have grieved, are grieving or yet to grieve.

My hope is that it will help put into words what is so hard to express. My prayer is that you will find God to be the ultimate Carrier of grief carriers."

I can wholeheartedly recommend this book for those of you who are grieving. Grieving takes many forms not just the death of a loved one although that is the hardest to bear, but grief can come in disappointment, lost love, lost relationship and lost hopes.

Margaret: I was born in Hull, the daughter of a vicar, who then took up a living in Scarborough. My brother and I were sent off to boarding school. At home, I became a member of Scarborough Yacht Club, and on leaving school I read for a social science diploma at Leeds University. I took a job as the assistant personnel director at Marldena Gowns in Shipley, but then decided to apply for training as a hospital social worker, starting at the London Hospital, whilst living in the settlement in Peckham. My first post as a medical social worker was at St James's Hospital in Leeds followed by one at Otley. I met my husband at Alwoodley Cricket Ground: he was playing and I was reading. We married in 1959 in Bath, where my family was living and had two daughters. One lives and works in New York, the other near Ripon. We have four grandchildren. I spent two years working for the Marriage Guidance Council, but eventually worked full-time at Chapel Allerton Hospital and the LGI. I spent five years on the Wheatfields committee and many years as a trustee of the Harrison Potter Almshouse Trust. I became a Soroptimist and a member of Bramhope Women's Fellowship, of which I am now a committee member

Michael: I was born in Leeds, went away to boarding school and did two years National Service in the Royal Artillery, serving in Hong Kong. Afterwards I served for a further five years in the Territorial Army with the rank of Captain. I worked for nine years in the family business of paper merchants, before training to be an English teacher. I did an Open University degree and eventually became the Head of English at Priesthorpe School in Pudsey, before



retiring in 1995. I have been member of Headingley Rotary club since 1996 and, when President in 2001, started the club's association with Caring for Life in Cookridge, in order to help with adult literacy, which I still do. I was a keen hockey player and cricketer and enjoyed playing the piano, until a stroke upset my coordination. I supported the Leeds Piano Competition for many years.

After Margaret and I moved to Bramhope in 1978, we both attended St Giles Church. I was on the PCC for three years and have been a sidesman for twenty. We generally attend the early service or Evensong. In 1981, Margaret received an invitation for both of us to the Buckingham Palace Garden Party. Because this clashed with Botham's famous Headingley test match, there was a conflict of loyalties. The Palace won. On my retirement we spent a month touring in South Africa, where we have relations. We both enjoyed caravanning and hill walking at home and abroad for over 40 years, but have now settled for cruising and playing bridge.

Leading your Church into Growth

The Leading Your Church into Growth (LYCIG) course took place in 2016 and was attended by many members of the congregation.

The course members put forward many suggestions for actions that might lead to growth in our church at St Giles. The idea of growth covered growth in numbers, spiritual growth and growth in outreach to the local community.

The ideas have been discussed by the PCC and the main areas for action included:

Work with young people Work with older people The need for more prayer

We are not able to do everything at once and we have to work within the limits of the resources and volunteers that we have. Having said that, we have been able to progress some of the ideas and I would like to highlight the achievements so far:

4th Sunday Children's Work

Children's work was one of the priorities of those who took part in our LYCIG sessions.

We now have a team to take this on and I would like to express my thanks to all those who have agreed to do this work. We have mainly experienced people who are current or ex teachers or church children's workers of many years standing.

Currently this will run the on 4th Sunday, but if there is demand we could expand it to take place on other Sundays. The dates up to Christmas are September 24, October 22, November 26, none in August or December.

The suggestion made at LYCIG was that the children have the same theme as that of the main service. So we are using the Susan Sayers 'Living Stones' all age programme, with resources for pre school children and those aged 6 to 10.

The children go out of church into the hall during the first hymn and return before Communion. So what do they get up to when in the hall? There are lots of different things happening depending on who is leading so far we have had stories from the Lion Storyteller Bible a special story telling Bible For children, crafts who will forget how we made a model of Jesus ascending to heaven, games and last month song and dance with the help of Youtube! It's lively and happy group so if you would like your children to join in, come along on any of the dates above and if you want to help please contact me.

Open House

Open House meets on the 3rd Wednesday of the month from October to June (2pm to 4pm). We are a cheerful little group who enjoy fellowship, tea and cakes. We always have a light-hearted activity or quiz which causes much hilarity.

Our numbers are growing - not just ladies but we also have several gentlemen. Why not come along – a warm welcome awaits.

Prayer

Prayer was agreed as a priority by all the LYCIG groups.

We have held some ad hoc prayer meetings at 7am in the chapel. These covered prayers following the referendum, the recent terrorist attacks and as part of the Archbishop of Canterbury's initiative called "Thy Kingdom Come".

The Healing Prayer Team have arranged for candle lighting to be provided at special services such as Mothering Sunday, Fathers' Day and Christmas to remember loved ones.

We would like to thank everybody who took part in LYCIG and pray that God will bless and guide our work.
