
It will soon be Christmas- Advent Sunday is on the 2nd December – so it's time to think about some Christmas reading. We have several relevant books in our library, and I can recommend all of them if you want a good read. I am not however going to write a review of any of them; I suggest instead that you might like to look at the Christmas story as it is written in the Bible. There are 2 versions, one in The Gospel of Luke, the other in St. Matthew's Gospel. It's worth reading both; there are differences between them, and together they complement one another to give the complete Christmas story. My reason for suggesting this is it takes us back to the real meaning of Christmas, the event itself in all its simplicity and wonder.

I am not looking forward to Christmas this year, or I should say I am not looking forward to the run up to Christmas. The distractions of all the hype, shops full of expensive stuff, the advertising-driven expectation that we need all this to have a good Christmas. But pause for a moment; now think about the UN envoy's recent report on Poverty in Britain – what does Christmas mean to the people he writes about? Need I say more, except that I think it's something we should all read.

review this year — I was in Waterstones yesterday, looking for one, but failed to find anything. However, my eye lighted on 'Love the World' by David Adam (one of my favourite authors), which I could not resist buying. Adam writes of the Glory of God and the wonder of his creation. 

Christmas and Christingle Services

Today, Christingle Services are a part of Christmas Services. We know they originated in Moravia. But what is a Christingle? Where was the first Christingle Service held? How were they originally made? The following facts taken from 'A New Dictionary of Liturgy and Worship' Edited by J.G. Davies (Publisher SCM Press Ltd) help to answer these questions.

"Although little is known about the development of the Moravian Christingle, it had its origin in a Children's Service held on Christmas Eve, 1747 in Marienborn, Germany. At this time, a group of Moravians occupied the castle there and they and their families customarily met for devotions in one of its rooms. On Christmas Eve, 1747, Bishop John de Watteville conducted a service for the children belonging to this group; their elders also being present.

Then Bishop de Watteville spoke to the children of the unspeakable happiness which is ours through the Saviour's birth, and how his coming 'has kindled in each happy little heart a flame which keeps ever burning to his joy and happiness.' For an impressive memorial of which each child shall now have a little lighted wax candle with a red ribbon...

This 'Candle Service' as it came to be called, became very popular in Moravian Churches throughout the world. But in Great Britain, probably at the end of the nineteenth century, the candle tied with a

red ribbon was replaced by a 'Christingle'. The name probably derives from the German 'Christ-engel' (Christ Angel) or 'Christ-kindl' (Christ Child).

The Christingle consists of an orange, in the top of which a small hole has been bored. A cleansed goose quill, from which the feathered portion has been removed, is wrapped in a white paper frill and inserted in the hole. The protruding end of the quill is cut into half a dozen sharp points to which are affixed blanched almonds, raisins, and small jellied sweets of different colours. A small Christmas tree

candle is pushed into the heart of the goose quill to complete the Christingle...

In the Symbolism of the Christingle, the orange is the world, the white paper frill represents purity; the nuts, raisins and sweets God's gifts to his children; and the lighted candle stands for Christ, the light of the world..."

The above information was provided by J H Foy, Bishop of the Moravian Church, and a former member of the Governing Board of the Moravian Church in Great Britain and Ireland. Incidentally there is a Moravian Settlement near Pudsey and its school was founded in 1753. Its School Motto is "Our Lamb has conquered, let us follow him".

for details). For the crafters amongst us, there are many retailers online selling biodegradable glitter.

- Buy local, this not only supports local businesses but also cuts down on the air miles of your purchases.
- 5. Take care when buying anything with 'fake' fur. If it feels really soft and realistic, it will be real fur. The poor animals this fur belonged to suffer greatly for these fashion items; small cages, fur removed inhumanely... I won't go on.
- 6. Christmas trees if you have an artificial tree already, Friends of the Earth suggest you keep on using it but if you are buying a real tree, check for the FSC or Soil Association certification to ensure it has been grown sustainably. You can also buy a potted tree and keep it for years. Remember,

- boys and girls: a tree is not just for Christmas and takes a lot of effort to ensure it stays healthy.
- Use LED fairy lights, they use far less energy than regular fairy lights. Keep them on a timer so that they are not on all day, wasting a considerable amount of energy.


