The church has its own way of counting down to Christmas, the season of Advent begins on 3 December. We look forward to two events, the celebration of the birth of the Christ child Emmanuel God with us, and also to Jesus' return at the end of times; so monumental themes for a monumental season.

As Archbishop Justin Welby says in his introduction to the reflective guide we've produced called #GodWithUs – Your Christmas Journey: "The constant refrain of Christmas, in carols and readings, is that God is with us. In whatever situations you find yourself this Christmas, God is with you – you need only turn to him and ask to know his presence".

This year's campaign has three key elements:

1. Three videos that tell the story of the joy of going to your local church at Christmas, which will be released throughout December on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and YouTube.
2. The new A Church Near You – our national church finder – which will point people to a Christmas service or event taking place in one of the

16,500 Church of England churches. This will launch in November 2017.

3. Your Christmas Journey, a series of short reflections throughout December and into early January 2018, introduced by Archbishop Justin Welby. The reflections have been written by soul[food] for people who are new to faith and to help us all grow in our love of God. People can receive the messages as texts, emails, on social media and Church House Publishing have produced a booklet which would be ideal for churches to give to those attending Advent and Christmas services

I was on the Children's Society Committee for 10 years and I remember coffee mornings in our garden and Victorian Tea Parties, when we all dressed up. I have also been on the PCC and on the Ecumenical Committee with Reverend David Robinson. For about 18 years I organised the Welcome Groups in Bramhope, which meant every road had either a Methodist or Church of England contact, who would tell any new neighbours about the services and activities of both churches.

Other interests over the years have included walking, yoga, watercolour painting, running a small book club for friends in Bramhope and being a committee member of the Leeds Fine Arts Society. Now we have 4 grandchildren and we like to see them as much as we can, as both families luckily live within 30 miles.

I have hijacked the library shelf this month to share an Advent story I read to Lily when she was younger. As a tiny girl she had always received a new Christmas book for her Christmas Eve bedtime story. As she got older, it was not so easy to find a suitable tale. Here is one of successful finds...

*"Dusk was falling. The lights were on in the Christmas streets, thick snowflakes were falling between the lamps. The streets were crowded with people"*

So starts *'The Christmas Mystery'* by Jostein Gaarder, an author most well known for writing *'Sophie's World.'*

*'The Christmas Mystery'* tells the Christmas story as a story within a story: Joachim is shopping for an Advent calendar with his father when they come across an old and dusty book shop. Joachim's father is quite anxious as it is November 30 and all the shops have sold out of Advent calendars (I can relate to that!).

The old book shop has a choice of two calendars but as he is deciding which to buy, Joachim notices another, older Advent calendar which has mysteriously

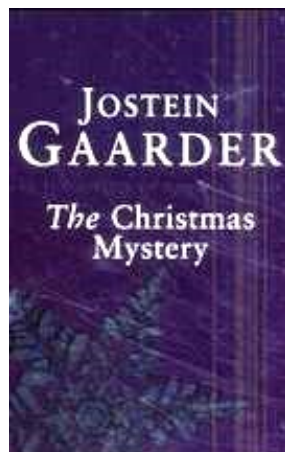
been propped upon one of the bookshelves, unbeknownst to the shop keeper. The mystery has begun... Joachim decides to buy this calendar. It is, of course, a magical calendar.

Joachim's adventure is told over the 24 days of the Advent calendar—a chapter a night or door, depending on whether you link it to your own advent calendars or bedtime story time. The familiar characters of the nativity story are introduced in less familiar settings; a new character each day.

I loved sharing this special book with Lily, I hope you enjoy it too.

# The history of Advent

The word “Advent” is derived from the Latin word *adventus*, meaning “coming,” which is a translation of the Greek word *parousia*. Scholars believe that during the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> centuries in Spain and Gaul, Advent was a season of preparation for the baptism of new Christians at the January feast of Epiphany, the celebration of God’s incarnation represented by the visit of the Magi to the baby Jesus (Matthew 2:1), his baptism in the Jordan River by John the Baptist (John 1:29), and his first miracle at Cana (John 2:1). During this season of preparation, Christians would spend 40

days in penance, prayer, and fasting to prepare for this celebration; originally, there was little connection between Advent and Christmas.

By the 6<sup>th</sup> century, however, Roman Christians had tied Advent to the coming of Christ. But the “coming” they had in mind was not Christ’s first coming in the manger in Bethlehem, but his second coming in the clouds as the judge of the world. It was not until the Middle Ages that the Advent season was explicitly linked to Christ’s first coming at Christmas.
