## From the vicarage

Hello Everyone

I have been invited to write the monthly letter by the wardens for this month on the basis that I am writing it before I actually finish at the end of January!

February sees the start of lent which is early this year Ash Wednesday is on 14 February Valentine's Day. That being the case for those who wish to attend the Ash Wednesday service and go out with their love on that night the service will be at 6.30pm. Please note the time.

The lent course this year is a BBC series on the last week of Jesus life. There are four films and we are showing them in the hall one morning and one evening per week. The course will be Café Lent style in that you can come watch the film and chat about it afterwards with coffee. There are some suggested points to guide your discussions but nothing is set in stone. So look out for the first evening one on 22 February at 7.30 and the morning one will be notified in due course.

The time has come the walrus said to talk of many things – (Through the looking Glass) and I have but a short time now in the parish. When Paul knew that his time was short he wrote the letter we know as 2 Timothy.

The letter encompasses advice for a faithful Christian and those in interregnum

Paul thanked God for Timothy's faith as I thank God for yours and asked that he guard it well. Good advice for Christians of today.

Above all things be faithful, 2:5 'an athlete does not receive the victor's crown except by competing according to the rules.'

Hold fast to the true 2:16 'avoid godless chatter, because those who indulge in it will become more and more ungodly.'

Be positively good and patient – you may need to be during a long interregnum! 2:22 pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace.

Yet the Lord rescued me from all of them (sufferings) 3:11 put your faith, hope and love in God and He will rescue from the interregnum.

I was born in Conisborough, South Yorkshire, the only child of parents who owned a small bakery in the village. When I was 7 we moved to Morley where my parents took on a fish and chip shop. Subsequently father went into engineering and mother went back to teaching. I went to Wakefield Girls High School and from then to Gipsy Hill Teacher Training College at Kingston on Thames in Surrey. I lived and worked in London for the next five years, first in an infant school and finally in a small unit for autistic children. This was in the early days of its diagnosis and most of these children had severe problems. During the last year, while sharing a flat with his cousin, I met my future husband Ian, just as he was to move to Edinburgh Royal Infirmary as a hospital pharmacist, so I made good use of the London to Edinburgh overnight sleeper before moving there in 1968, where I taught in a school for the partially deaf until the birth of our first son Robert. Our first house was in the village of Roslin just outside Edinburgh, where the now famous Rosslyn Chapel was our village church and Robert was christened there.

We moved to Bramhope in 1973 when Ian took up a pharmacy post at St James's Hospital and we attended St Giles from then on. Two more children followed, Simon and Anna. We have had very many close family connections to St Giles, where as an adult I was confirmed; two children

were christened, all three confirmed and two married at St Giles.

I taught at Richmond House School Far Headingley for 17 years.

I helped for many years with the Sunday School when my children were growing up, I have been on the Women's Fellowship and Mother's Union committees and currently I am on the Children's Society committee having taken over as box secretary in 1996.

My three children are married with two children each and I am very fortunate that they all live locally. I have been doing voluntary work with a group of blind and partially sighted people for the last 15 years.

I have some very good friends, many from St Giles, with whom I am lucky to share

### A (not so brief) history of 40acts

This little acorn began 6 years ago, to turn Lent upside down, on it's head and instead of giving up, the idea was to give out with a simple generous act for 40 days. And so 40acts was created. No one at [Stewardship](#) would have predicted that within 7 years over 100,000 folk would sign up and embrace Lent so differently. The acorn planted, put down firm roots, opened up and unleashed a wave of international generosity.

*'40acts is a fantastic excuse to go and do something slightly out of the ordinary, to step out of my comfort zone and to start a conversation'*, observed one keen supporter. 40 days of generous acts has become an antidote to our self absorbed lives with our 'to-do lists', agendas and me first attitude.

When Debbie Wright began working for Stewardship, Lent was approaching and she heard the familiar conversations among her friends about whether to give up coffee or chocolate, TV or Facebook, and it struck her again how odd it all was. Yes, she thought, sacrifice and discipline are all well and good, but somehow Lent seemed to have more to do with health

kicks than spiritual preparation. It all felt a little too inward looking and about myself.

A fortnight into her new job at Stewardship, and her decision to take the post seemed in some way related to her Lent musings. *"I didn't want to be in a job where generosity was solely about how much money you could give. Fortunately for me, Stewardship wanted to talk about generosity in a broad and holistic way, focusing on being generous with your time, talents, skills and attitude as well as money. That's what convinced me to take the job."*

Debbie's thoughts about Lent burned deep enough within her to consider sharing with her boss, Daniel Jones. He'd been wrestling too, wondering how to get good teaching on generosity into churches. Having tried to reach church leaders, he was steering Stewardship towards a different route: trying to reach the people in the pews directly.

*"I didn't know Daniel very well at the time," says Debbie, "but I floated the idea and suggested publishing forty reflections as a challenge over Lent. Without a minute's hesitation, he said yes!"* Other

## From the library shelf

This month a review of Karen Armstrong – The Case for God.

Armstrong has a CV which includes being a nun, a student and teacher (of English), a writer and broadcaster, and an 'activist' (my word) for religious understanding. This book, one of just more than a dozen by this author, is (like marriage) not to be undertaken lightly; but can be very rewarding (marriage again).

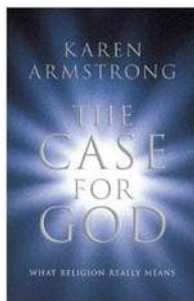
It has a chronological framework, beginning with the people who painted on cave walls at Lascaux (among other places) some 30,000 years ago. We start here because Armstrong is one of those who interpret the Cave Paintings as central in Palaeolithic rituals to do with the hunt, with animal sacrifice, and perhaps initiation ceremonies. In other words, they are an insight into spirituality among the earliest humans. It is perhaps a relief to move on swiftly via the Buddha to Confucian China, only to trip over one of the insistent themes which appears first on page 33: "Religion was a matter of doing rather than thinking". Really? For a philosopher? Apparently so: Confucius set much store by the practice of ritual. Then we arrive at the monotheistic religions of Judaism, Christianity and Islam. For them all, coming through the arguments over the nature of God and the meanings of ancient writings, "Faith was purely a matter of commitment and

practical living". (Page 101). This was true also in the third monotheism of Islam: "Theological speculation that results in the formulation of abstruse doctrines is ... self-indulgent guesswork about matters that nobody can prove one way or the other but which makes people quarrelsome and stupidly sectarian" ... "The fundamental message of the Qur'an was not a doctrine but an ethical summons to practically expressed compassion ..."

But argument there was, as there always has been, and Armstrong gives an interesting account of many such. For example, we get a picture of tremendously dynamic questioning and reinterpretation in both Judaism and what was becoming nascent Christianity following the trauma of the destruction of the Temple in AD 70.

I have written about a third of the text, and our Editor will want to cut words if I go on. The best thing is to read the book! I want to read it again, but it will have to be my own copy, because our Librarian tells me to put this one back on the shelf so that someone else can have a go.

team members bought into the vision and between them they came up with a list of forty people to write the reflections – about a quarter being staff and the rest church, work or family connections.

And so 40acts was born. The plan was simple; to send to subscribers a Bible-based reflection on a particular aspect of generosity twinned with a practical challenge to benefit others. That first year was a hand to mouth affair, with only half the contributions written by the time Lent began, but there were already signs that pairing Lent with generosity was a compelling proposition.

Mike O'Neill, Stewardship's Chief Executive, knew that if the campaign were to spread, it would need support and others quickly came on board. That whole first year made me realise that the essence of 40acts is relationships. In giving out, you open up someone's ability to receive and in that process a conversation starts."

'Generosity is incredibly infectious and every year we are taken aback' reflects Daniel. 'We have never had any formal marketing or advertising, people just share the idea. There is just something incredibly compelling and attractive to live a life that puts generosity first, puts others first'.

40acts has helped people speak to strangers, forge deeper relationship with their neighbours and take risks that they might otherwise have stepped back from.

Over the years the campaign has received awards and accolades, but the real trophies are the stories that come from participants themselves. Like the time in 2014 when two 40act-ers independently started giving out chocolate to strangers on the same crowded commuter train for Chocolate Tuesday, sparking a surge of Twitter interest and appreciation.

Then there was the Muslim man in the fourth year who wrote to say that signing up to 40acts had played a key role in helping him learn to admire the Christian faith and become more tolerant. And the girl in her 20s in Northern Ireland who came back to faith as 40acts created something that was relevant, community based and focused on others.

40acts has grown because individuals have caught the vision for themselves. For Sam Donoghue of Childrenswork magazine, this new view of Lent made perfect sense. 'I'd done the giving up bit and was more than ready to take on something new. I loved the kids' resources in the campaign – kids really get generosity and the graciousness of God.'

40acts helps turn observers into givers, and strangers into receivers. It is as accessible as it is infectious, and is only just beginning.
