

From the Vicarage

Happy New Year to you and yours and may God Bless you with health and happiness throughout the coming year.

WE have a whole New Year to look forward to: an open and wide vista, untouched, unwritten on and in our hands as to how we spend the next year.

In November, we had a visit from Bishop Paul to celebrate 10 years of my ministry here and also to formally confer on me the position of vicar, whereas I was previously priest in charge.

The Bishop reminded us of the story of the British rowers and their gold medal. In 1998, consistently failing to medal or even make the final of major regattas, the GB Men's Rowing Eight decided to fundamentally change the way they worked and how they worked with each other. Their focus became purely about performance, the results they hoped would follow.

They approached things differently, critically asking the same question with every single action they took... Will It Make the Boat Go Faster? Along their journey they learnt the sustainable, dependable techniques and behaviours that drove continuous team improvement. The outcome 18 months later, against all reasonable odds, was a stunning Olympic Gold on the waters of Sydney.

In 2016 we as a parish began the Leading your Church into Growth; we did it in order to grow our parish numerically, spiritually and in service to others. The Bishop wants us to adopt the same principles: everything we do needs to be looked at in the light of 'Will it make our church grow?'

So in January we will celebrate the coming to the end of our learning and discussing and begin to look at how we can put into operation the ideas and suggestions that have been made during the past year. All will be looked at in the light of 'Will it make our church grow?'

Our celebration will be on 29 January in the 9.30 service; following the service there will be a brunch in the hall and an opportunity to find out about various areas of service that will need volunteers if we are to put into operation some of the ideas and suggestions that have been made.

A summary report on the outcomes of the Leading Your Church into Growth will appear in the February magazine.

We are not the only church in Bramhope and work closely with our brothers and sisters in Christ at Bramhope Methodists. Each year we have a number of services

In 1972 Nancy Bundey and Win Shirley organised a team to provide a lunch on the first Wednesday of September through to the following July each year. It has been hugely successful feeding people at each session. Nancy was in charge until 2000 when Mary Burnell took over the organisation until this year.
