Dear Friends





An Epiphany

The weary parish priest of a black township in South Africa forced himself to attend the last part of a school play during the final week of Advent. This is how he tells the story:

'After the Wise Men had come and gone I noticed the arrival of three more strange characters – one was dressed in rags, hobbling along with the aid of a stick. The second was naked except for a tattered pair of shorts and was bound in chains. The third was the most weird. He had a whitened face, wore an unkempt grey wig and an Afro shirt.

As they approached, a chorus of men and women cried out, 'Close the door, Joseph, they are thieves and vagabonds coming to steal all we have.' But Joseph said, 'Everyone has a right to this child – the poor, the rich, the unhappy, the untrustworthy. We cannot keep this child for ourselves. Let them enter.'

The men entered and stood staring at the child. Joseph picked up the gifts the wise men had left. To the first strange man he said, 'You are poor: take this gold and buy what you need. We will not go hungry.' To the second he said, 'You are in

chains and I don't know how to release you. Take this myrrh – it will heal the wounds on your wrists and ankles.' To the third he said, 'Your mind is in anguish. I cannot heal you. Maybe the aroma of this frankincense will sooth your troubled soul.'

Then the first man spoke to Joseph, 'Do not give me this gift. Anyone who finds me with this gold will think I have stolen it. And sadly, in a few years, this child will end up as a criminal too.' The second man said, 'do not give me this ointment. Keep it for the child. One day he will be wearing chains like these.' The third man said. 'Lam lost. I have no faith at all. In the country of my mind there is no God. Let the child keep the incense. He will lose his faith in his Father too '

While Mary and Joseph covered their faces the three men addressed the child. 'Little one, you are not from the world of gold and frankincense. You belong to the country of want and disease. You belong to our world. Let us share our things with you.' The first man took off his ragged shirt. 'Take these rags. One day you will need them



when they tear the garments off your back and you will walk naked.'

The second man said, 'When I remove these chains I will put them at your side. One day you will wear them — and then you will really know the pain of humanity.' The third man said, 'I give you my depression, my loss of faith in God and in everything. I can carry it all no longer. Carry my grief and loss with your own.'

The three men then walked back out into the night. But the darkness was different. Something had happened in the stable. Their blind pain was diminishing. There had been a kind of epiphany. They were noticing the stars now.


very single evening As I'm lying here in bed, This tiny little prayer Keeps running through my head:

Did you lock the front door?

They are those moments when you wonder if you may be 'losing it'. When you drink a cup of tea, but can't remember even having made it. When you leave home, and have to go back because you can't remember locking the door. When you drive a long distance, and have no memory of the journey. When you turn up for work, and it is your day off.

But don't worry – such incidents are very common for all of us, and are simply an indication that your mind is on 'autopilot', according to a recent survey by the Child Accident Prevention Trust. "We all revert to autopilot just to get through the day – there is simply too much to remember," said one expert.

And while the trait can unsettle us at times, it

actually helps our brains to avoid becoming overloaded with information. You can even put your 'autopilot' to good use – protecting your family from danger.

It works like this: "The trick for busy parents is to make safety part of their everyday routine and develop safety habits before their child has a chance to put them to the test." Accidents can happen when adults leave hot drinks too near the edge of counter, or forget to tie up the cords of blinds, or leave household cleaners about.

You've got to have the recipe

A teenage girl was complaining to her grandmother how everything was going wrong for her: she hated school, she was fighting with her sister, her mum was driving her crazy, and a friend at school had let her down.

Meanwhile, her granny was baking a cake. She asked her granddaughter if she would like a snack, which of course she did. "Here, have some cooking oil."
"Yeuch" says the girl, horrified. "How about a couple raw eggs? " "Grannie, that is disgusting!" "Would you like some flour then? Or maybe baking soda?"
"Grannie, they're horrible!"

To which her grandmother replied: "Yes, all those things seem bad all by themselves. But when they are put together in the right way, and allowed to change in the oven, they make a wonderfully delicious cake!" She continued, "God works the same way in our lives. Problems can bring you blessings of growth in your life. But you need to let him change you on the inside."

The King of Instruments

On addition to the recent installation of new lights and a fresh coat of paint to the inside walls of St Giles, we took the opportunity to give the organ trumpet pipes a much needed clean. Due to a build up of dust over the years, these pipes were quickly going out of tune and becoming unusable. So we called in Malcolm Spink, our organ repairer.

I had expected a quick brush down but how wrong I was! Out came all the 58 trumpet pipes, out came buckets of hot soapy water. The pipes were washed, rinsed and dried. Each pipe has at least 7 individually made parts so utmost care was required to avoid any mix up.

Malcolm explained to me one reason why the pipe organ is known as "The King of Instruments" and started to get mathematical. One set of pipes is known as a 'stop'. Thus an organ with one stop can only make one type of sound. An organ with two stops can produce 3 sounds (stop 1 by itself, stop 2 by itself and both played together). An organ with three stops can produce seven sounds (1,2,3; 1+2;1+3; 2+3; and all 3 together). Four stops can produce fifteen sounds (1,2,3,4; 1+2;

1+3; 1+4; 1+2+3; 1+2+4; 1+3+4; 2+3; 2+4; 2+3+4; 3+4; and all 4 together).

If you study the above, you can see that by adding a single stop, the

number of sounds that can be produced is doubled plus one; i.e. 1, 3, 7, 15. So far so good, but what's the significance of this? Well, this doubling of sounds with each additional stop, quickly reaches a very large number with a few stops. Thus an organ with 25 stops can produce more sounds than there are seconds in a year. 35 stops can produce 34,359,738,367 sounds. It is fairly well agreed that the universe is up to 20,000,000,000 years old, so we can see that 35 stops can produce more sounds than years that the universe has existed.

A large cathedral organ may have 65 stops and is therefore capable of playing 36,893,488,147,419,103,231 different sounds. If we divide this by the number of seconds in a year, we find out how many years it would take to go through all the different sounds of this large organ, if we selected a new sound every second. The

answer is 1,169,884,834,693 years; so we can see that even if we started playing this organ with 65 stops when the universe was created we still have a long time to wait until we have played them all.

Now you know one reason why the pipe organ is known as The King of Instruments and we use it to help us worship The King of Kings!



Pride and prejudice - it's a human identity thing

his year brings a number of special anniversaries, including 200 years since the first publication of Jane Austen's great novel 'Pride and Prejudice' in 1813. The famous story of Elizabeth Bennet and Mr Darcy was based on the prejudice that existed between the classes in the 19th century, and the pride which could keep lovers apart.

'Pride and Prejudice is about that thing that all great novels consider, the search for self,' observed the writer Anna Ouindlen. But the search for self goes back further than 200 years. Jesus himself focused on our search for identity in the parable of the prodigal son (Luke 15). In Jesus' story we can see that pride is represented by the younger son and prejudice by the older brother. One son was caught up with 'me', while

the other was hung up on 'them'. When we get caught up with these, it's easy to miss the real joy of knowing God's love and life.

The younger son only found true joy when he swallowed his pride and left the life he thought would bring him satisfaction. It was pride that made him want to go his own way and do his own thing. Pride often hinders faith in Christ: what must I give up? What will others think of me? When the younger son came to his senses, he decided to go home to his father, just like us when we run out of options! His father rejoiced in the return of his son. accepting him and throwing a party for him.

On the other hand, the other brother lost his joy because of prejudice. When his brother returned, he was indignant. I've earned it, I'm worth it and I'm jealous:

these

are the attitudes which robbed him of joy. Yet just as this man forgot the mercy shown to him by his father, so we too can forget God's mercy towards us, in our dealings with others.

Jane Austen wrote at the time of the Napoleonic Wars. The story is told of a mother who approached Napoleon seeking a pardon for her son. The emperor replied that the young man had repeated a certain offence and justice demanded death. 'I don't ask for justice, but plead for mercy,' the mother explained. 'But your son does not deserve mercy,' Napoleon replied, 'Sir,' the woman cried, 'it would not be mercy if he deserved it, and mercy is all I ask for.' At this the emperor spared the woman's son.

As we consider our lives at the beginning of 2013, what do we risk forfeiting, through our pride or prejudice?

Colonel John Thomas North (1842 – 1896) Donor of Kirkstall Abbey

orth was born on 30 January 1842 at 7, Bywater Street, Hunslet, a narrow street of back-to-backs in an area of railway sidings, coal staithes, and huge foundries belching out smoke.

Nearby in Hunslet Road was John Fowler's Steam Plough Works, where, after an apprenticeship, North found a job as a millwright, a machine engineer. He married and began a family. Then around 1869, Fowlers offered him the chance to go to Chile, an important export market for their booming business. He spent thirteen years there, soon leaving Fowlers and working for himself. He finished up a millionaire, mainly from the processing of nitrates.

North returned to Britain in 1882 to promote his business interests. He bought a mansion at Avery Hill near London and spent huge sums extending and refurbishing it in spectacular style.

But he never forgot his Leeds roots and family and was always ready to back worthy causes, making substantial donations to the Infirmary and the Yorkshire College. His most



spectacular gift came about in 1889, when he heard by chance that Kirkstall Abbey and its grounds were up for auction and were at risk of being bought by a group of Manchester businesses as an amusement park. He promptly promised to buy the Abbey himself, with extra land, and hand it all over to the citizens of Leeds. The purchase cost him £10,000. In return he was honoured as the first Freeman of the city. When he arrived in Leeds for the ceremony he was mobbed and cheered.

Today he is mostly forgotten, but his gift of the Abbey and its grounds — where he told people he had fun as a child, playing 'kissin-the-ring'! — is there for everyone to enjoy.

The Women's Fellowship Carol Service raised £94 for Wheatfields Hospice, the organ being played by Rosemary Cysarz.

Canon Clayton entertained the Mother's Union by playing the piano for their Christmas party and then in January he spoke to them about Superstitions.

Jean Snowball reported that the Adel & Bramhope District Brownies, Guides and Ventures held their Carol Service at St Giles.


