

#### Children's work @ St Giles

I thought that I would make that there is a theme for a final report to you about the children's work that we have achieved in the last 11 vears. None of this work is possible without many, many volunteers and that will continue to be the case after I have retired. I want to personally thank everyone who has made our work with children possible; without you there would be no children's work.

#### **CHRISTMAS & EASTER** CRAFTS

These take place in the school holidays just before Christmas and on Good Friday morning. The aim is to provide good crafts for the children to make, refreshments, a short interlude of songs and a story.

The first time we did this in 2007 I remember we had about 10 children, but we persevered and by Christmas 2016 we had 98 children plus about 50 parents and a good time was had by all.

Gradually over the years the work on this has joined with Messy Church and now forms part of a coordinated programme.

MESSY CHURCH Following on from our growing work with the Christmas and Easter crafts we began our first tentative steps into Messy Church way back in 2009 and we still have an active and happy band of children attending each month. The idea of Messy Church is

the afternoon such as heroes from the bible -Abraham, Moses, Joseph, Paul, Peter or more general such as harvest, creation, bible mountains, roads or seasides. The messier the craft the better; who will forget when we made primordial slime, threw fruit at a target for fruits of the Spirit, or the more off the wall such as making a balloon driven car. or rainbow fruit kebabs. The food crafts are always popular as are the refreshments, first made by Marva and then Diane. The adults are treated to cake and other delights, while the children enjoy tea. And of course there are games galore.

Fiona Wrightson was joint leader with me for many vears but she has now moved on and Suzannah Hattersley now helps to lead this work. When I go she will need support and volunteers to keep this work going. Can you help?

#### KIDSCLUB

We started this venture at Bramhope Primary School in 2008. It is an after school club on Tuesday afternoons run during term time.

Again there is a bible theme based on the Lion Story Teller Bible; we explore the story using drama, games, occasionally model making and of course crafts.

We have had many children through this club. The year groups involved are from year 3 to year 5. Although

some of our children have kept on in year 6.

Children from this group have come to confirmation including some parents.

My role as leader will now be taken over by Denise Cooper and Eddie Whitehead, However we do need someone to coordinate the paper work and as ever more volunteers would make the rota much easier! Can you help?

4<sup>th</sup> Sunday Service Children's Activities We have had more than one attempt over the years at getting this off the ground. I think that we have now found the right formula.

We have been running the activities for about 12 months now in the church hall. They are usually connected with the theme of the day that the adults are having in church.

So far as leader I have organised this work and arranged the rota and activities. If this work is to continue then it will need a new leader and coordinator. The leader may come from our existing volunteers but if not can you help please?

TODDLER PRAISE (PREVIOUSLY MONDAY AFTERNOON CLUB)

I began this shortly after I started at St Giles. The purpose was to provide a meeting place for mums,



carers and their under 5's with Christian input in the form of songs, story and simple crafts. Our favourite song was Jesus loves me when I jump, wave, smile, and so on.

The group started out with mums who had come to the church for the baptism of their chidlren. And some of those mums have gone on to be very active members of our church.

In the autumn of 2017 we had to stop this small but active group due to the retirement of Fiona Wrightson who led this group for many years. With my illness followed by my forthcoming retirement I decided that this group would need to restart under new leadership. Can you help please?

#### 1<sup>ST</sup> BRAMHOPE GUIDES

Fiona and I have wanted for some time to form a Guide unit. Bramhope has not had any Guide units for many years and there is a demand from this age group of 10 to 14 years. We have spent about 6

months going on various courses and setting up the unit. We are the unit leaders with Fiona very much to the fore. We currently have 14 Guides and demand for places is high. We meet on Wednesday nights at 6.45 pm to 8.15 in the church hall.

The Guides have all made their promise, one of which is to help others. This has included attending our all.together Harvest service and Toy service and donating food and toys for others. Thank you Guides.

I will be continuing as a leader of the Guides after I have retired.

#### ALL.TOGETHER

This second Sunday service is not actually children's work directly but a vehicle where young families and their children can feel comfortable. And those who are young at heart can join in too. It really is an all age service and many of our more mature congregation love it too. The hymns are modern,

lively, and led by our band of musicians and singers. We include the children in the service and provide activities for them.

#### CATS

Our Carers and Tots group came out of our work on leading your church into growth. It was instigated by the PCC in 2013 as a means of serving our community and reaching out to those outside the church.

After a period of 6 months in 2014 when it was led by a too busy vicar, Kevin volunteered to run the group. Kevin and his team of volunteers now run a highly successful playgroup popular with childminders and families alike.

My Prayer is that God will continue to bless all the children's work at St Giles.

May God bless all the children we have worked with and all those you will contact in the future.


