

From the vicarage

Dear Friends

When I got married 40 years ago last month, the vicar insisted that we had a psalm as well as a reading; we chose, I think, psalm 67. Imagine my surprise then when the choir sang psalm 128 which contains the words 'Your wife within your house shall be like a fruitful vine'!

Many people have sought out this support and gained much comfort, hope and healing from the prayers. 'For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there I am with them.' Matthew 18:20

Those lovely verses from James affirm to us the only drawback to our prayers is that we cannot pray for you if you do not let us know. He tells you to call the church's elders. It's even easier today you can email or phone. We cannot pray for you if have not contacted us. If you are in hospital, please ask your relatives to contact me, if you need a listening ear and need prayer, please phone me or Bryan. We are here to pray for you: just let us know.



We are Yorkshire through and through, born in Burley, Leeds in 1930 and thus children of the war years with memories of food, clothing and sweet rationing, sirens, gas masks and air raids and Dudley did two years National service with the RAF.

Our first date was at the Capital ballroom, and we were married at St. Matthias's Church, Burley in June 1953.

Dudley was a keen sportsman, playing football, rugby, cricket, golf, tennis and squash. Dudley was very supportive of his girls' church activities staunchly attending all the relevant events and church services. All three daughters were confirmed and married at St Giles. Dudley regularly played football for the fathers' team against the choirboys, and transported the Long Meadows flock to Sunday school. Currently Dudley is a member of the Men's Supper Club and runs the bar assisted by his friend of 55 years, Les Barton.

Dudley was head of the totally feminine household - including 2 frequently visiting grandmas and female pets and therefore was more than pleased when of his six grandchildren, 3 were boys - they were blessed with 3 boys and 3 girls.

Betty was also sporty in her youth playing hockey, tennis and a keen swimmer. After the birth of their first daughter Betty became a stay at home mum. Life in Long Meadows and St Giles was hectic, but happy and friendly with lots of get-togethers. She was a member of the school PTA and has been a member of the Women's Fellowship since its early days; many times she has been on the committee, as well as being treasurer and secretary. She explained she was from the charity Knitted Knockers UK who supply, free of charge, prosthetics for ladies post mastectomy and lumpectomy surgery. They are supplied in 15 different cup sizes (if you have complex size needs then this can be catered for), colours and they even have one available which is suitable for swimming. They are made from 100% cotton yarn and made by authorised volunteers on receipt of an order. The water sports one is made from acrylic yarn.



This is a specialist charity which generously provides their goods for free. Ladies you may wish to support them or like me take advantage of their services. For those who crochet rather than knit, they have crochet patterns too.


