





From the vicarage

ow many Anglicans does it take to change a light bulb?

One to call the electrician, one to mix the drinks, and one to talk about how much better the old one was.

I have a stock of these lightbulb quips and you will find the odd one spattered throughout my copy this month.

The purpose of them is to draw your attention to change. The whole Christian faith is based on change. Change from darkness to light, from unbelief to faith, from hate to love, from death to life. The fact is the Christian faith, belief in our Lord Jesus Christ means one thing: change of us, the people we are, to the people that Jesus wants us to become. And the powerhouse for that change is the Holy Spirit.

On June 4 we celebrate Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit to the disciples. Acts 2. At Pentecost the disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak in foreign languages they had never learned before. A crowd gathered, people from all over the world, and that crowd listened and understood as the disciples preached the Gospel. The Apostle Peter stood up and addressed the crowd – he gave a beautiful sermon that God the Holy Spirit inspired him to preach.

The reaction to that sermon was 3000 people came to faith and were baptized. All we know about the 3000 is they were not Christians, and on that day they were changed into believers.

At Pentecost we see the change that took place in the disciples, and the change that took place in those 3000 people. Our broken and needy world needs change. The world needs the change that faith in Jesus Christ can bring. Are we like the disciples before Pentecost - confused, weak, timid and afraid of declaring our faith?

The Holy Spirit was given to us at our baptisms; at our confirmations all we have to do is call on His power to turn us more and more into the Christian that God wants us to be. We need to call on Him to change us.

Pentecost can be summed up in one word: change (and no light bulbs required). May the Holy Spirit continue to work in you, to change you, to fan into flame the fire that is in each one of you.

God Bless you and those for whom you pray.



The book I have chosen for this month is 'Being Disciples. Essentials of the Christian Life' by Rowan Williams. It is based on addresses given by the author between 2007 and 2012.

This is a beautiful and profound book — if you only ever read one book on living the Christian Life, let it be this one. Several reviews are given at the start of the book, one of them remarking that 'It is impossible for any review to do it justice'. I would agree with this and so I will not write a detailed review. It is after all, only 86 pages long, with 6 chapters dealing with different aspects of the Christian Life, and it is not difficult to read.

The sub-title – 'Essentials of the Christian Life' is just what this is. Essential is a word that is so often used these days in marketing and advertising, often for things that are not essential or even necessary! The meaning of the word essential is 'absolutely necessary, extremely important' and the subject matter of this book is exactly that.

And what is meant by discipleship? Chapter 1 begins: 'Discipleship, as the title of this book indicates, is a state of being. Discipleship is about how we live; not just the decisions we make, not just the things we believe, but a state of being'. This gives a flavour of what is to follow in this beautifully written book, sometimes almost poetic in its use of language.

I bought the book some time ago, when the Leading your Church into Growth Meetings



were taking place. The title caught my eye, as I had been thinking about what it means to be a disciple of Christ. This book explains just what discipleship means, with simplicity, clarity, and gentleness. That is not to say it is not challenging, it is, but it is also a comforting and hopeful book as it explores our relationship with God and with each other.

I will be buying my own copy and reading it again, probably many times – it is a book to have to hand throughout the faith journey.

Another church year has passed and I am writing on behalf of the PCC to say thank you to all those of you who continued to be faithful to the work of your parish church in Bramhope. Your gifts and contributions to the running costs of the church during the year 2016 are very much appreciated.

I would also like to add my personal thanks. It really is only by the gifts that you and other worshippers make that continues the work of God in this place. Often people think that a congregation like St Giles gets its income from church HQ. Not true — every penny spent keeping St Giles in our village is donated by you the congregation and people who visit us for baptisms and weddings. There are no government grants to support the work of the church.

Our costs like your own never go down; costs rise relentlessly upwards and our income is under ever increasing pressure. This is often because people move away or their circumstances change. We will be bringing our income to the attention of the whole of the congregation and a stewardship campaign will take place this year. However in preparation

for that, at the end of the annual meeting I did ask the following:

- When did you last increase your giving to the church? Often if we use a standing order we set it up and then never change it. My challenge to everyone is to look at whether it is time to increase that standing order you took out so long ago.
- If you don't regularly give to the church through standing order or envelopes and consider yourself part of our community could we ask you to make regular donations through standing order or envelopes please?
- And if you don't Gift Aid your donation, if you are a taxpayer, then please also consider gift aid it will cost you nothing.

Getting to know...

BILL & JANET CUNLIFFE



Bill and Janet have worshipped at St Giles since they moved to Bramhope in 1969. In the 70s and 80s we were on the PCC and the early 70s set up the Junior church of which Bill was the leader and taught the 11-15-year-olds (in those days there was no competition from Sunday football) and Janet taught the tiny tots - a 10 year stint. Bill, along with Jim Harrison and Dennis Marshall ran a church football team which won three trophies: the team contained some still familiar St Giles names. Mumbys, Archenholds, Balls, Cunliffes, Sunderland, Kendall - Smiths and Harrison. It was an evangelical team, encouraging young lads that if they came regularly to church they could play for the team and partake in the church's Christmas parties and sports days.

Janet has been and is still on the Women's Fellowship committee for more years than she would care to think; and has been involved for many years in the Wednesday luncheon club

Bill and Janet are sidespersons, and Bill is one of the church photographers, an interest which stemmed from his professorial career in dermatology, a very photogenic medical speciality. He and Janet met beside a hospital

bed at Manchester Royal Infirmary where Janet was a nurse. Those were the days, working 100 hours per week; including being on call alternate nights and alternate weekends and living in hospital accommodation which had quaint rules, such that you were not allowed to sleep with your wife, but you did get your shoes cleaned daily! Janet had to live in the nurses' home and had to be back by 10 pm!

Would you believe that in the 1960s nurses when they had a child were no longer allowed to work? For 20 years Janet did a lot of medical secretarial work for Bill.

Since Bill retired in 2003 we both worked voluntarily fundraising nationally and locally for the British Skin Foundation. Since 2010 we have been volunteers and patient advocates for the Leeds Dermatology Patient Panel at Chapel Allerton hospital as well as fundraising for the Dermatology Friends of Chapel Allerton Hospital.

Prior to moving to Leeds we lived in Manchester and Newcastle. Janet was born in Gatley - a then, posh suburb of Manchester, and Bill lived in Blackburn and Oswaldtwistle. Janet did not believe Oswaldtwistle existed until Bill proposed.

We enjoy reading, audible books, gardening, walking, TV dramas and sport. Yes, we do confess to liking Downton, Strictly and Leeds United.

We are blessed with three children and seven grandchildren and four grandpets - is there a correct word for pets belonging to children? All


