Canon John Clayton, BA, MA. -- 1911-2018

Many of us first met the Canon when he retired as Rural Dean and Vicar of Otley in 1976, and came to live with his wife in Sandy Walk, Bramhope. He had become very well known throughout his Ministry over the years in Dewsbury, Halifax, Wakefield, Bradford and finally Otley, where years after retirement people would come up to him and say "you married us!", or "you baptised our children". It is now astonishing to realise he has been with us in Bramhope for 42 years, sadly of course losing his beloved wife after 10 of those years.

Canon John's ministry continued throughout his retirement, first helping out during an interregnum, then 4 years as Priest in Charge at Leathley. Again at St. Giles he was there, at first along with Canon Hammerton, following the departure of Revd. Raymond Ward, then later Revd. David Robinson. He was present to assist and support them in their Ministries, and again more recently with Revd. Janice Smith. Indeed up to his

100th birthday he would still take some Thursday morning communions, and preach once a month at Evensong. The Canon's door was always open, for meetings, bible study, personal advice and wisdom, or to talk about church, or matters of personal faith. He was a founder of the Healing Prayer Group at St. Giles, with David Robinson.

In 1997 one of his highlights was to receive the Maundy Money from the Queen in Bradford Cathedral. Years before in 1968 the Canon, along with others from Otley churches was responsible for erecting the large cross on top of Otley Chevin which, to this day, still witnesses over the Easter period.

A remarkable man, with an astonishing ministry, a man of experience, wisdom and knowledge, always with a friendly welcoming smile. He will be greatly missed, and long remembered. R.I.P

Love thy neighbour: Good Samaritan

“Love Your Neighbour As Yourself”. Mark 12.31

Martin Lee, convenor of the Men’s Supper Club, is this month’s Good Samaritan. Compiled by Bill and Janet Cunliffe.

Many of the inhabitants of Park Terrace in Pool are very fortunate in having a truly good Samaritan, Martin Lee living on their street. Martin very actively goes out of his way to be caring for his flock in and around Pool village.

His attributes are many. The cornerstone of his good deeds is his caring for the neighbours. He regularly pops his head into neighbour’s houses to make sure that they, especially the more vulnerable neighbours, are okay; many just like the chance of a chat over a cup of tea or coffee, especially along with cakes made by Martin himself. Martin’s most popular cakes are profiteroles. He is also well known for his “cuppa soup” especially carrot and coriander. Martin is also the street “do it yourself” man, mending, for example curtain rails, repairing gates, replacing light bulbs, taking out and returning dustbins. No task is too small, such as undoing marmalade jars, or too big such as, when it is snowing or icy making sure that the north facing road and paths are snow/ice free – and the street alone is 100 yards long!

Transportation is another aspect of his neighbourly love, taking neighbours to the doctors, dentists and if necessary shopping.



Martin Lee, no relation to Hazel, definitely demonstrates his old-fashioned values in the 21st-century and was recognised in 2017 when the neighbours voted Martin to be the Pool Honorary citizen for 2017, an accolade which was bestowed on him by the Lady Mayoress of Leeds in the Pool Institute.

Boiler Appeal

In last month's magazine Joanne & June mentioned the appeal for funding a boiler. So I thought it appropriate to provide more detail so that you know what any contributions will go towards.

St Giles has two gas fired boilers; one for the church itself, housed in the 'boiler house' under the organ vestry. The other one is in the kitchen and heats the hall, Meeting Room, toilets and corridors and provides hot water for the kitchen and toilets. It is this that we need to replace. It is about 20 years old and has sprung a slow leak. If you were in the hall during the cold weather earlier this year you may recall that the boiler seemed to be struggling to keep us warm.

After taking advice from heating engineers, we have decided that the best course of action is to fit a new boiler AND a new, bigger gas supply to it, AND to flush out the radiators to remove the years of built-up sludge.

If this boiler were to fail during the winter, the hall would be unusable, causing severe disruption to the St Giles community as well as hirers of the hall. Your PCC have therefore decided to aim to carry out the replacement work during this summer holiday period. Please do support the appeal. In the meantime we are seeking a 'Faculty' from the Diocese for permission to carry out this work.

This Prayer was written at the door of a Christian hospital.

And the following are a part of his Evening Hymn "Glory to thee, my God, this night"

Forgive me, Lord, for thy dear Son, the ill that I this day have done. That with the world, myself and thee

I, ere I sleep, at peace I be.

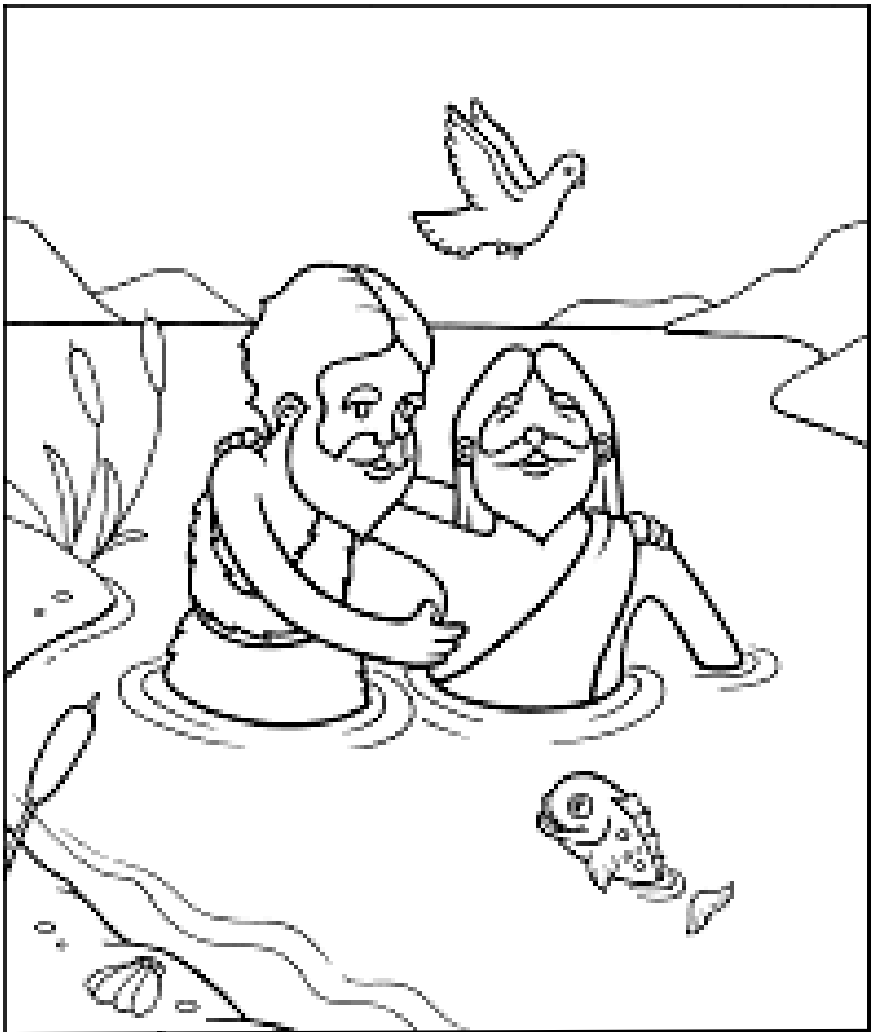
