## A tribute to John Smith

For much of his life John lived in Beighton, a mining village just outside Sheffield, and from the age of 15, he regularly played the organ at the local Methodist Chapel.

Moving to Alwoodley six years ago and having been a “roving organist” at six churches, Janice invited John to help out at St Giles. Despite John having vowed not to get involved with too many things he threw himself into this role. John also organised many fundraising organ recitals, special music for services and combined choir oratorios.

John was a naturally talented musician, never classically trained but with an ability and a delight to play any instrument with a keyboard that he found in front of him. He had an electric organ at home, along with piano and electronic keyboard, and there was little John enjoyed more than ‘just playing’.

In January, John received a certificate from RSCM for playing church music for 65 years. As the appointed organist, John played at Sunday worship, funerals and weddings, refusing to accept any fee. He did it for the love of playing. He also found himself landed with the position of Choirmaster, a post he had not anticipated. Over the years he nurtured a group of choristers, many of whom had

been raised in traditional choral church music, and his friendly, happy and patient disposition enabled him to get on with everyone.

John had an enormous repertoire of music, ranging from the loud and exciting Bach Toccata & Fugue, to the more peaceful Bizet’s Pearl Fishers, and if you relaxed for a minute you would find the tune you were hearing was a song from one of the musicals. He had the skill to improvise between pieces and in ‘gaps’ in the services, sometimes producing variations from the hymns just sung. He would enjoy introducing the choir to new music, taking the time and trouble to record a CD for each choir member to help learn the piece, never failing to show his appreciation of the choir’s efforts. He has given faithful service to St. Giles.

John’s delight of music came out in other ways, and a Grand Piano in the atrium the Bexley Wing at St. James’ Hospital, where John was going for treatment, was too much to ignore. From then on, every week, John, with Joy as helper and general guide to patients coming in for treatment, went in to play, not only for his own pleasure, but for the delight and relaxation of the many people going in with more serious things on their minds. Along with 6 other musicians John and Joy helped to raise £30,000 in three years for cancer research and improving the patient experience for patients with cancer.

## DAVID SHAY

David has many of his family roots firmly and indulges himself with world-famous Pontefract cakes. One house belonging to the Shay family, which was built in 1813, still exists. The present incumbent Tom Shay Dixon was interviewed by Michael Portillo in one of his famous train journeys whilst passing through Pontefract.

David's parents married in skirts since his father was a member of the famous Black Watch regiment. David went to primary school Knottingley and subsequently attended the grammar school, King School Pontefract 1955-1960.

David married Marlene at St Giles' Church Pontefract in 1965 and their first house was close by in Ferrybridge. David has three children Nicola, Jayne and Mark. Jayne lives in Bramley and has one child and one grandson. Nicola who helps with the sound desk at the main second Sunday service has two children, Jasmine and Jacob. Mark is married to Sarah and they have one child, Luke. Sarah runs the 50/50 club at St Giles. Sadly Marlene died in 2012 and the funeral took place at St Giles, Brplanted in Pontefract and has had virtually lifelong connection with St Giles churches. David was born in 1944 and christened at St Giles Church Pontefract.

His family in Pontefract can be traced back to 1770. Apparently 4 family roots grew liquorice. The family provided many

outlets with liquorice for medicinal and confectionery purposes. David still likes amhope.

David joined Martins Bank - which subsequently became known as Barclays Bank, at the age of 16 years until retiring 40 years later.

Because of the site of Barclays' regional office, David moved to Bramhope where he has had three houses. Initially on Tredgold Crescent; thereafter he built a house on Creskeld Crescent which is still known as Barclays house. One day his children asked who owned the house and David said "Barclays" so the children came home one day from the Yorkshire show with a sign "Barclays" house. David now lives on Creskeld Lane and still retains his property in Spain which was bought in 1986 - where the family spend their holidays.

## Love thy neighbour: Good Samaritan

Over recent years we have all become accustomed to the harrowing sights of families fleeing the terrors of war, persecution and famine. Against all the odds, some of these people arrived in the UK and were sent to Leeds. Here, they were met by a most caring and compassionate organisation known as the Leeds Asylum Seekers' Support Network (LASSN). Whilst seeking asylum, refugees are not allowed to work and are classed as 'destitute'.

There are three aspects of LASSN's support work: befriending; teaching English, and, grace hosting which involves providing overnight accommodation, meals and a warm welcome. It is this third element of LASSN's work which we were drawn to.

During the last 12 months we have welcomed 18 guests from 14 different countries. Across Leeds there is a network of 40-50 grace hosts who have, over the same period, provided accommodation for 90 guests over 4,995 nights. Each

guest is unique with their own personal story. Our youngest guest was 19 and the oldest 71. Some speak little English so an atlas can be a useful tool to generate conversation. Many have specific dietary requirements so this keeps us on our toes in the kitchen!

Flexibility is a key component of grace hosting as is a good sense of humour. You have to smile at the absurdity of watching University Challenge with a non-English speaking young man from Eritrea.

We count it as an honour to be part of the LASSN grace hosting team. In Matthew's gospel Jesus encourages us to invite strangers in and feed them. For various reasons not everyone can do this. We are grateful that our situation enables us to respond to the Lord's encouragement to share our plentiful resources with those who through no fault of their own are destitute and homeless.

## What a send off for Janice!

This was a very memorable day for all the right reasons. Working with Janice, our excellent churchwardens, Joanne Dawdry and June Pickles organised the church service and the after event to remember and celebrate Janice's very successful ministry at St Giles Church, Bramhope.

Janice was initially appointed as Priest-in-Charge in 2006 and became Vicar in 2016 and has worked ceaselessly to make St Giles what it is today, a thriving and vibrant church.

As a testament to Janice's success the church was full to the rafters, requiring additional chairs along with a small overflow of the congregation watching the service relayed into the church hall.

The service was an excellent example of the extended church family with representation across all ages, ranging from 10 weeks to 106 years (Canon John Clayton), along with representation from many of the church and village organisations including Brownies, Guides, the British Legion, the Parish Council and pupils and staff from Bramhope Primary School.

As ever, Janice spoke with no notes, linking nicely, as she has done for 12 years, the Epistle and Gospel readings with topics relevant to 2018. The theme centred on looking out for the lost or forgotten and the message of God's love. As well as teaching and healing Jesus gave

the ultimate sacrifice in dying for us and thus we have the secret for eternal life - something we should tell friends and enemies. Her sermon received a spontaneous long round of applause. The hymns and songs were sung with much gusto, were ably led by John Smith and the Choir and Andrew Hudson with the Band.

After the service virtually all the congregation, approximately 240, packed the church hall to hear words of tribute. Joanne introduced the contributors. Joseph Taylor, aged 10, with great confidence highlighted and thanked Janice for the many children's activities and groups she has established.

Alison Richardson through her personal circumstances highlighted Janice's kindness and her being there for many people in difficult times.

Bill Cunliffe commented that we would need a week's seminar in order to adequately highlight just what Janice has done at St Giles in Bramhope. In summary Janice is good at giving that spiritual hug at the right time and has satisfied the Congregational needs for a vast number of people and together with her vision and outreach, created a thriving church population. This has happened through hard work, well beyond the statutory EU 40 hours week along with her positive charismatic personality and her happy warm and loving enthusiasm. When she
