## **Dunstan (909 - 988)**

Junstan stands out as an example of what just one person can achieve when they follow the call of God on their life.

Dunstan was born near Glastonbury, of a noble family with royal and church connections; his uncle was archbishop of Canterbury. But in 935, at the age of 16, he was accused of 'studying

## ... chief of all the saints who rest at Christ Church'

the vain poems of the pagans' – and expelled from court. He nearly married, but instead made private monastic vows and was ordained a priest by Elphege, bishop of Winchester.

Dunstan felt God's call on his life, and responded. That decision was to shape English history.

Not at first, however. For Dunstan began his priestly life by simply returning to Glastonbury and living as a hermit. He painted, embroidered and did metalwork. But when in 939 Edmund became king of Wessex, he recalled Dunstan and made him abbot of Glastonbury. The monastic life of the country was all but dead: the Danish invasions and the hostility of local magnates had seen to that. Dunstan set out to change all this, and went on to restore monastic life in England, under the Rule of St Benedict.

Down the years, Dunstan saw kings come and go: Edmund, Edred, Edgar, Edward. Under King Edgar Dunstan was made bishop of Worcester in 957, bishop of London in 959, and archbishop of Canterbury in 960. Thus was born a fruitful collaboration between King and Archbishop which was to reform the Church in England. Monastic orders began to thrive once more. After the Conquest, the days of Dunstan would be looked back on as the 'golden age'.

Dunstan was zealous for the faith. He taught, prayed, fasted, repaired churches, acted as judge, inspired national laws of the land, made sure taxes were paid,



and encouraged his monks in their manuscripts and prayers. He remained active right to the end of his life: he preached three times on Ascension Day 988, and died two days later, on 19 May, aged nearly 80.

They wrote of him: he was without doubt 'chief of all the saints who rest at Christ Church' (Canterbury).

It has been well said that the 10th century gave shape to English history, and Dunstan gave shape to the 10th century.

## Three in One

May is a busy time in the church calendar with Ascension Day, Pentecost and Rogation Sunday

#### Ascension Day - 9 May

40 days after Easter comes Ascension Day. It may seem crazy to call it Eastertide when Easter is clearly over! but these are the 40 days during which the Risen Christ appeared again and again to his disciples, following his death and resurrection.

The Gospels give us little of Christ's teachings and deeds during those forty days. Jesus was seen by numerous disciples: on the road to Emmaus, by the Sea of Galilee, in houses, etc. He strengthened and encouraged his disciples, and at last opened their eyes to all that the Scriptures had promised about the Messiah. Jesus also told them that as the Father had sent him, he was now going to send them - to all corners of the earth, as his witnesses.

### Rogation Sunday - 5 May

Rogation-tide arrived in England early in the eighth century, and became a fixed and perennial asking for help of the Christian God. On Rogation-tide, a little party would set out to trace the boundaries of the parish. At the head marched the bishop or the priest, with a minor official bearing a Cross, and after them the people of the parish, with schoolboys and their master trailing along. Most of them held slender wands of willow.

At certain points along the route - at well-known landmarks like a bridge or stile or ancient tree, the Cross halted, the party gathered about the priest, and a litany or rogation was said, imploring God to send seasonable wealth, keep the corn and roots and boughs in good health, and bring them to an ample harvest. At one point beer and cheese would be waiting.

In the days when maps were neither common nor accurate, there was much to be said for 'beating the bounds' - still very common as late as the reign of Queen Victoria. Certainly parish boundaries rarely came into dispute, for everyone knew them. (Do you know yours today?)

#### Prayer for Pentecost

Loving, generous Father, In your love you gave us Jesus – sent him out to bring us back to you. And when he had completed his work, by



dying on the cross, rising again, and coming back to you, you hadn't stopped giving. You gave us your Holy Spirit. You sent him at Pentecost and you send him today. Thank you Father.

Fill us with your Spirit Lord. Equip us with the gifts of your Spirit that we need to serve you. Ripen in us the fruit of your Spirit, so that our lives will be witnesses that you are alive today in this world; that you have the power to renew and restore broken hearts and lives and all creation.

Fill us with your Spirit Lord. Send us out in the Spirit's power to live and work for you, to make your difference today, for your glory.

Fill us with your Spirit Lord, we pray. Amen.

## Food Banks – a sign of the times?



The rising cost of food and fuel, combined with static income, unemployment and changes in benefits have seen increasing numbers of people turn to food banks in the UK recently.

Recognising the value of these banks, retired archbishop Rowan Williams has become patron of one in his new home town, Cambridge.

The Trussell Trust, a
Christian charity, now
oversees over 250 local food
banks on a franchise basis.
Banks typically provide
boxes of three days'
emergency food to tide
people over whilst putting
them in touch with other
agencies which might be
able to help in the longer
term.

Many of the banks are located in or around church premises. Thousands of people are giving time and money to find premises, gather supplies of food and make it available to those in great need. It's good for the helpers, too – many are rubbing shoulders with, and hearing stories from, people they've never come across before.

The trust that has had a leading role in the food bank movement was founded in 1997 by Carol and Paddy Henderson and was based on a legacy left by Carol's mother, Betty Trussell. The work had begun when Carol and Paddy were working for a UN feeding programme in Bulgaria and rescued a street baby, Boris. Paddy and Carol vowed to keep him alive and eventually he was taken into an orphanage.

The work started in Bulgaria soon spread to Britain. The Trust's network fed over 128,000 people in a recent 12-month period, distributing 1,225 tonnes of food donated by the public, schools and businesses.

The Rotary Club of Headingley have recently held a Bridge Drive in St Giles Church hall to raise funds for setting up Leeds Food banks. They raised £600 at that event alone and have now raised over £1000 for the Trust.

A Project Team to establish Foodbanks in Leeds was established last year, and it is intended that four Food banks should be established across the city — Leeds East, West. South and North.

Leeds West is now established, springing from the work undertaken by St George's Crypt in Armley.

Leeds East has now appointed a Co-ordinator and will cover Lincoln Green, Gipton and Seacroft.

Leeds North will cover the Miles Hill and Moor Allerton housing estates, and Leeds South will cover LS10/11.

## What is Rowan Williams doing now?

R owan Williams, former Archbishop of Canterbury, has kept just one project from his Lambeth Palace days: the Michael Ramsey Prize for theological writing. Williams founded the Prize in 2005 to encourage the most promising contemporary theological writing and to point it out to ordinary Christians, the people in the pews like vou. Rowan Williams is still determined to get across the message that no one should be scared

of theology.

The Prize is awarded every other year and takes the form of an original artwork and £10,000 for the author of the prize-winning book. The authors of the other short listed titles will be awarded £1,000 each. This year's Prize will be awarded on 28th May at a gala lunch at the Hay Festival (tickets available from www.hayfestival.com).

# People who 'do' God, do good

Cociety is now more reliant on churches and religious groups meeting



'crucial' social needs that were once met by the state. That is the view of Baroness War-

si, a minister in the Foreign Office and the minister for faith. She believes that society is being threatened by a rising tide of 'militant secularisation', and has defended religious people's right to practise their faith in public. She insists that "people who do God, do good".

A recent government survey has found that religious groups are helping to meet society's needs during the recession. Churches have been providing nearly 100million hours of unpaid voluntary work on social projects each year. Lady Warsi, a practising Muslim, told Parliament that faith groups can "reach areas of need that government cannot."

## **Christian Aid Week**

Christian Aid Week was first held in 1957 and is Britain and Ireland's longestrunning fundraising week. It is famous for its distinctive red envelope that drops through the letterboxes of millions of homes every May, and for the thousands of volunteers who dedicate their time to raising vital funds to help poor communities around the world build a better future for themselves.

This year, Christian Aid Week is highlighting the fact that tonight 1 in 8 people will go to bed hungry, but there is enough food for all to eat and have their fill if certain changes are made. Christian Aid works in partnership with communities and organisations in 48 countries. supporting innovative projects to help people transform their own lives from barely surviving to truly thriving. In droughtprone southern Zimbabwe, Christian Aid partner Dabane Trust worked with

local



communities to access the clean, naturally filtered water that is stored, hidden. beneath sand-bed rivers, ensuring people have a supply of clean water. Now they can water their gardens all year round, meaning they can grow a variety of vegetables to eat and to sell. Husband and wife Jabulisa Ndlovu and Zuzeni Nyathi used to struggle to find enough for their children to eat, but Zuzeni says: 'We [can] now eat every day at any time – we are always full.

This Christian Aid Week, bite back at hunger and give a gift that will help people living in poverty out of poverty.

£1.85/€2.30 could pay for 1kg of sugar bean seeds for a family like Jabulisa and Zuzeni's, giving them a crop of 20kg of beans.

£2,000/€2,486 could pay for a sand dam for one whole community like Jabulisa and Zuzeni's, helping them to have a constant supply of water.
