

From the vicarage

First a thank you to all those who made our Easter celebrations such memorable ones! We really did have joyous celebrations at all our services on Easter Day. A special thank you to the flower arrangers who made our church look even more beautiful than it normally is!

We move on now in our journey through the church's year to Ascension Day on Thursday 25 May. Long gone are the days when schools gave a day off for this church festival and announced the 11+ results on the same day, but their association with the ascending to heaven of our Lord is for ever linked in my mind.

And it seems appropriate, given that the ascension describes the disciples' final period of instruction whilst Jesus was still with them. Jesus is preparing the disciples for their future work. It is a future that will see them declare Jesus as Lord and they are told to declare it to all nations.

And before he ascends to heaven Jesus gives the disciples a promise that he will send the Holy Spirit to fill them with power for the task set before them.

So how did the disciples spend the time waiting for the Holy Spirit? In both versions of the story in Acts 1 verses 1 to 11 and Luke 24 verses 50 to 53 the disciples spend their time in prayer. And the disciples who so often got things wrong, misunderstanding the parables and deserting Jesus at his arrest and crucifixion, in the end, right at the end of Jesus' earthly ministry, the disciples got it right. They passed the test. The disciples did as they were told and stayed in Jerusalem and prayed continually.

And we too await the return of Jesus. We like the disciples are asked to tell people about Jesus everywhere to the ends of the earth.

We are not to stand and stare at heaven whilst we wait for Jesus' return but to act, because Jesus will return. The disciples took that on board and lived and acted as if his return would be at any moment. We are believers today because of the effective witness of the disciples.

So on this Ascension Day will you be having a day off or passing the test, continually praying and witnessing for Jesus, in constant expectation of Jesus' return?





"Do not stand at my grave and weep"

MANY years ago, my Father, a Parish Priest, took a funeral at Birkdale Cemetery, Southport. As it happened the funeral was for Nancy's Grandmother. Nancy's Mum, looking down at the coffin in the grave, was understandably upset, and I gather my Father went to her, put his arm round her shoulder and said "Don't cry, she is not there". Recently these words have come back to me in quite unexpected form.

The last concert sung by Otley & Ilkley Choral Societies featured two requiems, the well-known Faure Requiem (sung in past days here in church by those of us in St. Giles choir), along with The Cantique de Jean Racine. The other was Eternal Light, written by Howard Goodall. Many of us know Goodall for his setting of 23rd Psalm as the signature tune for the Vicar of Dibley. Eternal Light is a requiem which, like Brahms' German Requiem, is intended as a comfort for the bereaved, and written on the 90th anniversary of the battle of the Somme, "in Flanders fields the poppies blow", with poems reflective of the relation-

ship of the departed with those they left behind. In the 5th section, the 'Lacrymosa', which means 'tearful', or 'weeping', those words of my Father suddenly came back to me, listening to the Baritone soloist, as he sings "Do not stand at my grave and weep, I am not there, I do not sleep", and again a few lines later, "Do not stand at my grave and cry, I did not die".

We have again just celebrated Easter and heard the words of the Gospels where Mary finds 'the gardener' who asks "Woman, why are you weeping, whom do you seek", and the other women finding an angel at the empty tomb who says "He has been raised He is not here". I have just attended yet another funeral, this one with a family connection. But at any funeral as any of us look at the coffin, the grave, or attend the crematorium, I hope those words will come back to us, "I am not there".

He is risen indeed - Alleluia!

The 40 Acts Challenge

This Lent I chose to attempt the 40 Acts generosity challenge. 40 Acts has been running for seven years and is organised by the UK Christian charity, Stewardship. Those who signed up for the Lentern challenge were sent an email each day of Lent, comprising of a verse from the Bible, a Bible-based blog and the act of generosity itself. The blogs were written by various Christians, including Bear Grills, Ram Gidoomal (Fairtrade) and Canon Ann Easter (Chaplain to the Queen) to name a few. All were thought provoking and inspirational in equal measure. The acts varied from donations of time to a good cause to acts of worship and allsorts in between. Some days you were given the choice of three options to complete the act: green, amber or red, being of increasing challenge or generosity.


