

#### Café-style Lent Course 2018

We tried a new approach to our Lent Course this year and ran a café-style course in the church hall. Morning and evening sessions were offered to cater for people's preferences. The course material was the BBC film "The Passion". It was split into four instalments. There was a starstudded cast including James Nesbitt and Penelope Wilton. The format of each session was: an introduction by the group leader, reading some bible passages relevant to the film, watching the film and finally the discussion.

The discussion was around some pre-set questions. People worked in small groups of 3-5 people and managed their own discussion. There was no feedback to the whole group as the intention was for the groups to have an informal discussion between themselves and to delve as deeply as they wished into the material. As with any such group, the discussion was confidential.

From my perspective, the film was excellent. It was very thought provoking. I felt that the Easter story came alive and it gave me food for thought. The questions were often quite deep and made me think.

About 30 people attended the course and the feedback has been positive. Some of the comments were...


Found the course thought provoking and challenging. We were put in the disciples shoes and that made us realize how bewildered and abandoned they must have

felt during the first Easter. These courses encourage us to discuss our faith.

Very thought provoking. Gave rise to good, questioning discussions. The realism made us realize the brutality of living under Roman rule. Good to sit with other people and share the discussion about the passion and resurrection.

This is my first Lent Course. I really enjoyed the group discussion on the reality of the film in contrast to what I learned at Sunday school as a child. Thank you to all who made this course happen.





#### Getting to know...

Neil and Jo have lived in Bramhope since 1996. Jo was in fact born in Kent, and trained as an Occupational Therapist in Northampton, but spent her early career in Yorkshire – working at Harrogate, St James's and Chapel Allerton hospitals. Her godparents were also locals – they were wardens at Barrowby House, the former C of E Diocesan House in Kirkby Overblow (where Jo and Neil later married). Jo moved jobs to Portsmouth in 1983, and then to Derby in 1987, where she and Neil met in 1989.

Neil, meanwhile, was born and grew up in York. He went to university at Keele, where his first degree was in Law, but he had long wanted to work in the NHS, and after doing a Masters degree in Birmingham, he has spent most of his career in NHS management. He has worked in Harrogate, Hull, Grimsby, Derby and Leeds, though he is now self employed and working only part time, as a consultant on various programmes for NHS England.

Jo and Neil married in 1990, and their two children, Catherine and Alistair were born in Derby. But a desire for the children to grow up in Yorkshire drew the family "back home" and Neil got a job as Head of Organisational Development with Leeds Health Authority, and Jo as an Occupational Therapist with Leeds Social



Services. The family soon became involved in St Giles. Catherine and Alistair attended Sunday School. Jo was a founder member of the Mums` group and became part of the Children`s Society Committee, for which she is now Treasurer. Neil has been on PCC, and was part of the Youth Management Committee that established the BASE Youth Group. Together, Jo and Neil also ran Pathfinders for several years. Neil and Jo's preferred service is the All Together one, for which Neil is one of the "screen team".

Jo is now retired; she is a keen gardener, and volunteers at York Gate Garden, in the café, the garden, and also leads one of their Heritage Lottery funded project teams. She enjoys quilting, and also stewards at Ilkley Literature Festival each October. Neil spends his "spare" time as a mentor for the Carer's Trust, and an Ambassador for the Carer's Alliance (both of them national carer support organisations). He is a Trustee of Harrogate Neighbours Housing

As a keen member of Team Bramhope over the last few years, it has been a pleasure to help raise funds for Candlelighters through participation in the Leeds Half Marathon. For those of you who are unaware, Candlelighters is a fantastic Children's Cancer Charity based in Leeds supporting children and their families from across Yorkshire as they come to terms with a lifechanging event. On May 20, the Church remembers how at Pentecost (Whit Sunday) the Holy Spirit came upon the Disciples in Jerusalem and empowered them to continue the work Jesus began of growing the Kingdom of God. Pentecost is often called "The Birthday of the Church". This is a Prayer for Pentecost:

O God, who on the Day of Pentecost enabled your Spirit-filled people to bear witness to their Lord so that people of different races heard the good news in their Mother tongue. baptise your Church today with the same Spirit of power, that it may fulfil its mission to preach the gospel to the whole creation and all the peoples of the world may learn Christ in their own language, to the glory of his name.

On May 27, the Church celebrates and reflects on the doctrine of the Trinity-how God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. This is a Trinitarian Prayer:

To God the Father, who first loved us, and made us accepted in the Beloved: to God the Son, who loved us, and washed us from our sins in his own blood; to God the Holy Spirit, who sheddeth the love of God abroad in our hearts: to the one true God be all love and glory for time and all eternity.


