

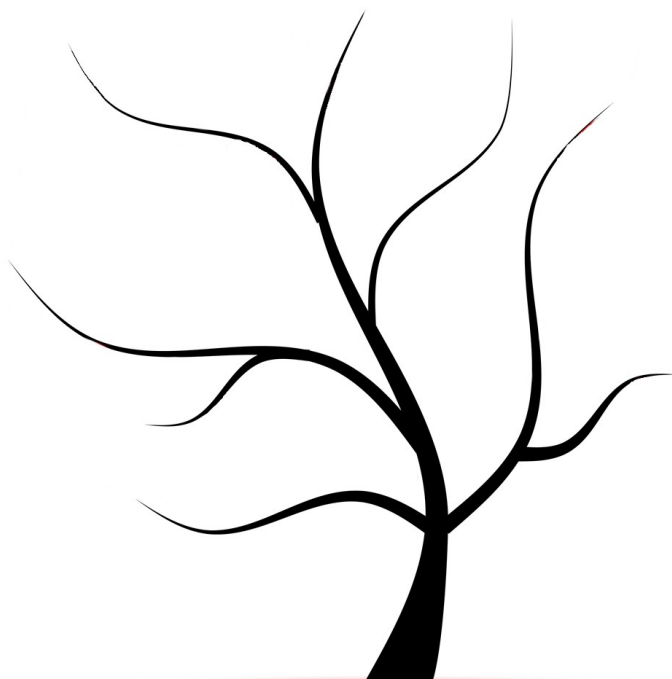

From the library shelf...

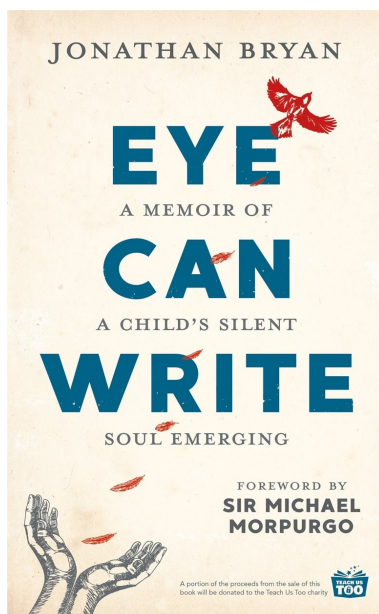
Thank you to Liz Johnson for bringing this month's book to my attention. It is 'Eye Can Write' by Jonathan Bryan with a foreword by Michael Morpurgo. The subtitle is 'A Memoir of a child's silent soul emerging', and this is what it is about. The child is an extraordinary boy called Jonathan Bryan.

Jonathan was born with severe cerebral palsy, causing him to have Profound and Multiple Learning Difficulties (PMLD). This book is his story, written partly by his mother, Chantal, and partly by himself. It is a story of determination, and persistence in the face of seemingly insurmountable odds, and more than that, a story of hope, faith and most of all love.

The introduction to the book, written by Jonathan's mother, is a very moving account of his birth, and early life, the many stays in hospital and wondering if in fact he would survive. He did survive, despite his profound physical disabilities which mean that he is not able to speak, or to communicate. He was 'locked' into his dysfunctional body, but his mother was determined to find a way to 'unlock' him, and she did. Using his ability to move his eyes he 'points' to letters on a spelling board; a helper then records the letters

indicated. So then he can 'talk' to others and of course he can write.

Jonathan's writing, both his prose and his poetry, are extraordinary – it's worth noting that his mother read to him from an early age, so perhaps we should not be surprised that his grasp of language is so mature. He tells what it is like to be a lively intelligent boy trapped inside his body, unable to do anything without help – he cannot eat so is fed via a tube and is totally reliant on his family and carers. We hear about his parents and his two sisters, Susannah and Jemima. He writes about his likes and dislikes, his meeting with Michael Morpurgo, receiving a Princess

Diana Legacy award, and appearing on CBBC.

Jonathan was born into a Christian family - his father is a vicar – and it is clear that faith in Jesus Christ has sustained them through the most difficult of times.

Jonathan's own faith in Jesus is obvious. His acceptance of his condition, of the frequent bouts of serious illness and the reality of a short life expectancy is remarkable, far beyond his years. He tells us how a spiritual experience when he was gravely ill changed his perspective on life, and reassured him that death is not the end, but a beginning.

Being able to communicate means that Jonathan can now reach out to others and his wish is that other severely disabled children might have the same opportunity to learn to read and write. He and his mother have set up the charity 'Teach us Too'. [The website is](#)

www.teachustoo.org.uk . Jonathan's blog can be found at www.eyecantalk.net

This book has a lot to teach us, and challenges our attitudes to those who are disabled, or in some way 'different'. Our assumptions about people are so often wrong. How often do we concentrate on what people can't do instead of focusing on what they can achieve? How many people like Jonathan are denied the opportunity of learning because no-one has taken the time to find out just what they can do?

My review gives you a taster of what this book is about, but you really need to read it yourself, and to hear Jonathan's voice to understand just what he has achieved. Or better still buy a copy – part of the proceeds will be donated to the Teach us Too charity.

Salt in the community

Salt – such a common, useful everyday thing. There are many types of salt. Common, table, rock, sea, mineral— just to name a few. It's a thing we take for granted.

Did you know there is a Salt Council? It regulates and promotes the use of salt in industry and retail. There are standards for salt purity as well as for gold, silver and other precious commodities.

Salt is essential for human life. When we cry, our tears taste of salt. When we sweat, that too is salty. Our diet needs a certain amount of salt each day to keep us healthy. Too little and we become ill – too much and it can kill. In our food too much means the food becomes inedible; too little and the food is tasteless. Sweet things, such as cakes and caramel can taste better when a pinch of salt is added.

Salting preserves food for later consumption. It's used as a cleaning agent – a sanitizer to clean wounds and stop infection. Salt, in the ancient world, was an expensive item and was looked after carefully so that it didn't lose its taste. That's why we have salt cellars. Used as a currency in the ancient world, the phrase *Being worth their salt* comes from when part of a Roman soldier's rations was paid in salt. That's where the word *salary* comes from. To be the *Salt of the earth* means you're trustworthy and reliable. We rely on rock salt mixed with sand to keep our roads open in snowy and wintery weather.

Mark's Gospel has a bit about the usefulness of salt in our lives when dealing with others. Jesus hears how his disciples have tried to stop someone not of their group, from healing in Jesus' name. The disciples were jealous of their rights, status and privileges. Jesus, though, isn't too bothered about this. What's important is that they were successful and that they're doing it *in his name*. By doing so, they were already part of the coming kingdom. *In Jesus' name* indicated their motivation. Bearing the name of Christ and acting in Christ's name shows that they belonged to Christ and were acting as Christ would.

In Matthew's Gospel Jesus encourages his disciples with the words *You are the salt of the earth*. The disciples still have a lot to learn about trusting the intention and abilities of others. Jesus tells his disciples to be careful that, in their enthusiasm, they don't put obstacles in the way of potential followers.

A community is a place of identity where people have a sense of belonging because they are known and recognized. Strong communities enhance the lives of their members. They provide protection and support and shape collective values. As with any community there is a constant tension between being inclusive or being exclusive. Of being in fellowship with many while maintaining the distinctiveness of a Christian community.

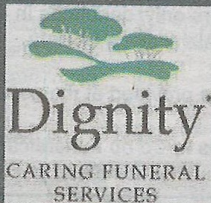

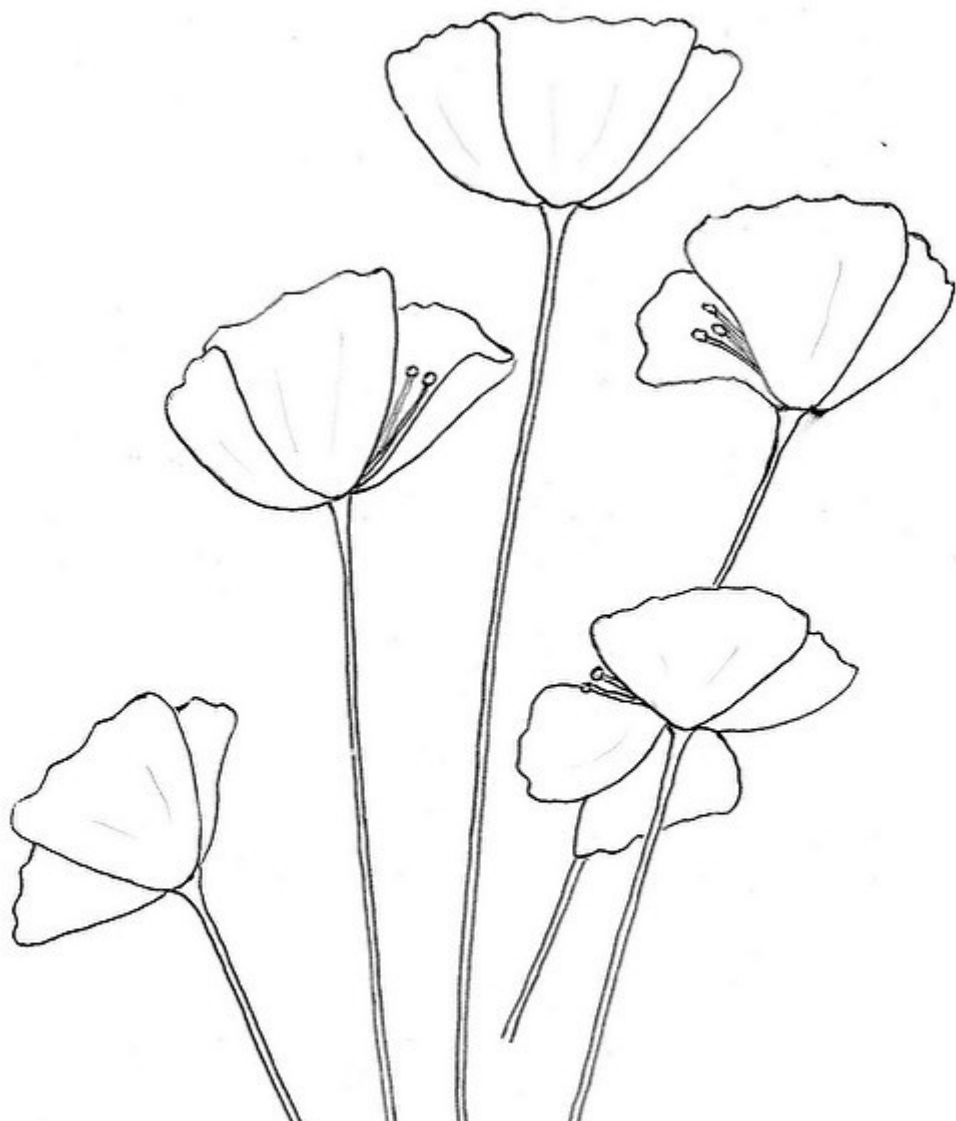
