From the library shelf...

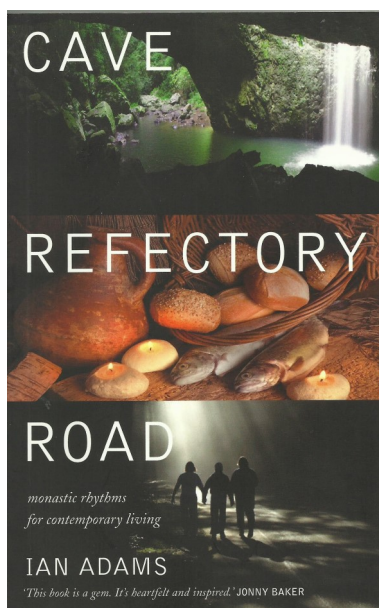
I have been looking for a book that is 'different', a little out of the ordinary, that sheds a new light on the Christian faith. 'Cave, Refectory Road' by Ian Adams; with the subtitle 'Monastic rhythms for contemporary living', does just that.

The author asks what we can learn from the wisdom and spirituality of monastic life that we can incorporate into our own ordinary lives. He explores three aspects of monasticism – Firstly devotion, our personal search for God (the **Cave** of the title), secondly the importance of community, (**Refectory**) and thirdly monastic life lived outside the monastery, in the public sphere (the **Road**). These three distinct but interrelated themes or 'paths' run through the book, and Adams shows how we can learn from them and put them into practice in our own lives.

The first half of the book deals with the development of Christian monasticism beginning with the Desert Fathers and Mothers who lived in solitude, silence and contemplation, often in isolated and inhospitable places. Later, small religious communities were formed near to settlements. The Refectory was where the community met to eat and where people from outside the community were made welcome- the monastic tradition of hospitality. Communities of reconciliation

and of energy (in the sense of being a centre of learning and welfare for the local community) are also discussed.

In the second half of the book the author shows how the monastic rule of life can be reinterpreted in our own lives. How do we establish a rhythm of life, slow down, to be more aware and give our attention to what really matters? How do we become more fully human in the way of Jesus? What can we learn from the monastic vows of simplicity, chastity, humility and stability? All these questions are answered with understanding of the difficulties we all face, and with simplicity, gentleness and wisdom. The last chapter

shows us how we can reach out to others particularly those whose life experiences are different from ours. At the end of most chapters is a short simple practice showing how we can make all this part of our own spiritual life. Each chapter begins with a poem by the author; for me these poems are one of the best things about this book. The book ends with a list of references and books for further reading; also a list of relevant websites.

spiritual rather than religious, with old ideas and traditions reinterpreted for our own time. This is done in such a way that it makes sense, even in our frantic world, and opens up the possibility of changing our lives, so that we see more clearly the path to follow on our own spiritual journey.

Caring For Life

The foundations upon which Caring For Life (CFL) is built are the very clear and explicit teachings of Jesus Christ Himself as revealed in the pages of the New Testament. People often question what that actually means and how it affects the way we work. CFL is a registered Christian charity (registration no. 1174982) with the aim of sharing the love of Jesus with homeless or vulnerable people by providing accommodation, ongoing support, love and friendship, and when necessary, providing that care 'for life'! Such care enables people to develop dignity and self-respect. Their motto is simple, "Sharing the Love of Jesus."

Thirty years ago, Peter Parkinson, a Baptist minister in Leeds, and members of his congregation were faced with a challenge to their faith that would change

lives forever. In 1986, several homeless young men started attending Leeds Reformed Baptist Church. This plunged some of the church members into a whole new form of outreach. They were challenged to follow Jesus' example of reaching out to those in need. This is how CFL began.

In 1987, Carey House was opened in order to share the love of Jesus, by offering security, safety, love and respect for the men for life, or as long as they wished to stay. Crag House Farm became the base for daytime activity projects, a place where vulnerable, socially excluded people could begin to re-build their lives. The projects at Crag House Farm started with a flock of free range hens; since then agricultural, horticultural, conservation, art and craft and woodwork projects have

developed, along with adult literacy, office skills, music and drama. From here, Caring For Life's (CFL) ministry grew rapidly.

CFL now has two supported homes, Wendy Margaret Home for eight ladies and Tindall House for eight gentlemen. These are real homes where each of our residents can settle, put down roots and feel safe and happy for life or for as long as they need to. They are not like hostels or even a building of individual units. Rather they are family homes where real life takes place.

CFL are acutely aware that there are many vulnerable and hurting people who are in unsafe accommodation where they can become victim to those who would prey upon them. Their vision for the future is to provide more safe housing for people who are in serious need and it is their prayer that they will find appropriate land to build suitable accommodation, both to replace current homes and to provide safe and happy homes for many more vulnerable people who need support.

Crag House Farm is the Headquarters to the Christian Charity seeking to support disadvantaged and vulnerable people here in Leeds. The farm is used to host its 17 therapeutic daytime projects including adult literacy, art and craft, conservation and mechanics to name a few.

October prayers & reflection

On October 4 the Church celebrates and gives thanks for the life and work of St Francis of Assisi.

The Cloud of Witnesses (A Companion to the Lesser Festivals and Holydays of the Alternative Service Book 1980) says this of him:



“He seems to have universal appeal as one who most nearly reflected the spirit of Jesus. His life of utter poverty and simplicity in the service of others was yet filled with joyfulness and love. His love of nature in all its forms as witnessing to the presence of God is probably the reason for his popularity today.



We should not forget, however, that his life saw much suffering and rejection (by family, as well as by officials in the Church), and this culminated in his receiving the stigmata (the physical manifestation of the wounds of Christ in his body”).

The words of the Hymn “Make me a channel of your peace” come from a

Prayer attributed to him.

You can also reflect on more of his Theology in the Hymn “All creatures of our God and King” which is based on his “Cantico di Frate Sole”.



This is another of his Prayers:

Lord, show me Poverty whom you loved so dearly...

I am full of yearning for my Lady Poverty; I can find no peace without her...

Jesus, you were very poor, and I want to call nothing under heaven mine but only to live on what others may give me.



And the following is a part of one of his Sermons:

We should not be wise and prudent according to worldly standards, but rather should be simple, humble and pure. We should never desire to be above others,

Upon all who do these things and endure to the end will rest on them the Spirit of the Lord; he will make his dwelling- place and his home in them and they will be children of their heavenly Father, whose works they do; they are the spouses and brothers and mothers of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Many things here for us to ponder.

Who was St Francis of Assisi?

Born in 1181, St Francis of Assisi was the founder of the Franciscan Order. He was born the son of a wealthy cloth merchant in Assisi and as a young man assisted his Father in the business and in this period of his life enjoyed "the good life."

In a war between Assisi and Perugia he was taken prisoner and became very ill. Soon after recovering he turned back from the war.

His life changed completely when he heard a voice which seemed to come from the Byzantine style Crucifix in the small derelict Church of San Damiano of Assisi "Go and repair my house, which you see is falling down". He did this and he sold some of his Father's cloth to help do it. Francis selling some of his Father's cloth to help repair the Church caused a permanent rift between him and his Father.

After this, his sole goal in life was to really know the Crucified Christ. After 2-3 years, 7 people chose to follow him and they went on preaching tours and this was the start of the Franciscan Order.

Peace for Francis was the greatest ideal and "Peace" for Francis was the Peace that Christ bought into the world at his birth and the Peace he brings to his disciples after his resurrection. He also saw all persons as his brothers and sisters no matter their religion, culture, tradition or nationality.

Another of his goals was to live the Gospel to the letter and he took to heart the teaching that true Disciples of Christ do not possess gold, nor money, nor haversack, nor shoes and no more than one tunic. Living the Gospel in this way determined every choice of his life.

He called himself "a friar minor" which means a "lesser brother of Jesus". He was known as someone who lived the Gospel without exception. You can see more of his theology in his Hymn which we know as "All Creatures of our God and King."

He was proclaimed a Saint by Pope Gregorio in 1228.
