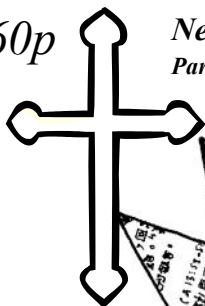

Well, I have already had the C word used to me several times; yes Christmas, as of today 12/09/13, is just 96 days away. If you think I'm a little premature at mentioning this, apparently a 'simply' marvellous store has had Christmas cards on sale since August.

What can you do in 96 days?

You could prepare for Christmas and I don't mean writing your cards, shopping for presents or ordering your turkey. You could really prepare for Christmas to meet Jesus word incarnate, Son of God, the Prince of Peace.

- Firstly pray more – Martin Luther was quoted as saying, "If I fail to spend two hours in prayer each morning, the devil gets the victory through the day. I have so much business I cannot get on without spending three hours daily in prayer." – I'm not suggesting 3 hours but more than the average Christian time of 12 minutes per day!

- Secondly – learn more about your faith. When did you last try to deepen your faith, try to find out more about Christianity? Then there's Just 10! A course that looks at the 10 commandments – are they relevant to today's society? It's a great course and a chance to be part of a home nurture group.

- Thirdly—make a resolution to worship every Sunday from now until Christmas. Over time, just like the patterns of prayer, worship patterns have changed from twice on Sunday to once or twice a month. Jesus himself worshipped regularly week by week (see Luke 4:16). We can do no better than follow Jesus'

example.

- If you like singing and want to join in with our carol services as part of the choir please contact me.

This Christmas let our preparations prepare the way for the one who came to save
'Make straight the way for the Lord.'

God Bless you all as we journey together in faith for the next 96 days.....

St Francis

One of the most popular modern hymns is 'Make me a channel of your peace.' It is based on a prayer attributed to one of the most popular saints, Francis. The Little Man of Assisi has inspired the faith and lives of many through his simplicity and love of creation. But the picture of St Francis talking to the birds and charming animals is only part of his story. His conversion to the Gospel message inspired him to renounce all possessions and to embrace poverty.

That example encouraged others to follow at a time where there was a deep concern about the wealth and authority of the church in Western Europe. Small groups of committed Christians came together to live out the precepts of Jesus' teaching, which they felt the institutional church had neglected. At first they were viewed with suspicion and were thought to be heretics – the hippies, the dropouts of the 13th century. And St Francis and his brothers were among them.

The healing power of laughter

The health benefits of laughter have become widely recognised in recent years. People feel less pain after a good laugh because (research suggests) it releases chemicals that act as a natural pain-killer.

Physical benefits of laughter have been found to include a drop in stress hormones and less risk of heart disease. Mental and social benefits include less anxiety and stress, improved mood and enhanced group bonding.

Humour helps us to keep a positive outlook in difficult situations, disappointments and loss. More than that, laughter gives us the courage and strength to find new sources of meaning and hope. It really is contagious – just hearing laughter primes your brain and readies you to smile. It dissolves distressing emotions. You can't feel anxious, angry or sad when you are laughing.

Humour gets you out of your head and away from your troubles. Infants begin smiling during the first weeks of life and laugh out loud within months of being born. But you can learn to laugh at any stage of life. Smiling is the beginning of laughter. It can help to set

aside special times to seek out humour and build from there. Pay attention to children and emulate them. They are experts on playing, taking life lightly and laughing.

The old advice to "count your blessings" will distance you from negative thoughts. When you hear laughter, move towards it. Share your embarrassing moments. The best way to take yourself less seriously is to talk about times when you took yourself too seriously.

There are now hundreds of non-profit laughter clubs world-wide, including many in the UK.

Be part of the Bible story in China

27th October is Bible Sunday, and this year the focus is on Bibles for China.

Have you heard the amazing story of the Bible in China?

How it's gone from being a banned book to a bestseller? How it's part of incredible Church growth, where around a million Chinese people come to faith every year?

And did you know that YOU – and your church – can be part of the story?

Bible Sunday, organised by Bible Society, is an annual opportunity to celebrate the blessing of owning and reading your own Bible. This year, it's also a time to join the amazing story in China – by helping provide Bibles to Chinese Christians too poor to afford a copy of the Scriptures themselves.

In the last 12 months, a million people have come to faith in China, according to estimates. Imagine that. It's equivalent to one more person making a

commitment to Christ by the time you read this article.

These new Christians are mostly from rural areas – and they are mostly poor. It

They'll be printed at Amity Printing Company in Nanjing – which is part-owned by Bible Society.

The printing presses are ready to roll – with the capacity to print almost 50 Bibles every minute. It's only the cost of the paper that's missing. Just 80p could buy the paper for one Chinese Bible.

Through Bible Sunday, your church can help raise funds to buy Bibles for Chinese Christians. The Bible Sunday theme this year is 'the Bible's message of freedom' – and there are stacks of free resources to download right now. There's everything from children's activities and fund-

raising ideas, to our origami dove challenge, to a four-week home group study on spiritual freedom.

means the cost of a Bible is simply out of their reach. And it's created a huge Bible shortage.

Nearly half of all Christians in China don't own a Bible. In some places 10 Christians have to share a single copy of the Bible between them.

Earlier this year, the Chinese government gave permission for the printing of 3.5 million Bibles for the churches there.

When atheism is the default stance of the media...

Atheism is a 'delusion', a 'fairy tale for those afraid of the light'. That was the message from Prof John Lennox from Oxford University, who urges Christians to have 'the courage to create public space' for the discussion of 'a biblical worldview' in society – citing the example of Tyndale's translation of the Bible into English 400 years ago.

Dr Lennox was addressing over 600 people at the recent Bible Society-sponsored National Prayer Breakfast, held at the Houses of Parliament. As Professor of Mathematics at Oxford University, Dr Lennox has frequently spoken out against modern-day atheism, calling Richard Dawkins 'wrong'.

Dr Lennox said that the new atheism is responsible for "the moral drift" in today's society. And he added that science and religion are not opposed. "There is no necessary conflict between science and God, the real conflict is between worldviews, atheism and theism," he said. "God is not the same kind of explanation as science is," he added. "God is the explanation of why there is a universe at all

in which science can be done."

He warned that, "The playing field is not level since atheism has become so dominant ... and is often regarded as the default position in the media." The risk of this is, he said, that society would forget "the contribution of Christianity to the moral foundations of our society". And he hinted, this was already to be seen in both the parliamentary expenses scandal, as well as the Leveson enquiry.

"If we teach people that morality is an illusion, they will begin to believe it," said Prof Lennox. "Many already have with the result that our institutions are awash with

scandal, families are increasingly fractured, people are lonelier than ever and trust is at an all-time low. We have sown a wind and are reaping a whirlwind."

Earlier, in a statement, the Prime Minister David Cameron said, "It is encouraging that Christianity still plays such a vital role in our national life. We are a country with a Christian heritage and we should not be afraid to say so."

David Cameron thinks the Bible is 'not a bad handbook', but has described his faith as similar to the patchy reception of Magic FM in the Chilterns. He said: "I'm a Christian and I'm an active member of the Church of England, and like all Christians I think I sometimes struggle with some of the sayings and some of the instructions."

While admitting he would find it "a little bit difficult" to follow the Bible to the letter, he said "what I think is so good about Jesus' teachings is there are lots of things that he said that you can still apply very directly to daily life and to bringing up your children. Simple things like do to others as you would be done by; love your neighbour as yourself, the Ten Commandments, the Sermon on the Mount."

Growing as a Christian

- do we need a coach ?

Just recently I passed a wayside pulpit which went something like this -

"The Lord said to John - Come forth and gain eternal life - but John came fifth and gained a toaster "

Some of us might say John needed a better coach but it got me thinking how as Christians we could benefit from coaching each other and being coached. You can be active in the church but inactive in its gospel so how do we do God's will and not ours ? Where do we find the courage to get it right?

Many professional coaches follow the GROW model where clients focus on a goal or dream they would like to achieve, examine the reality of the situation, think of a variety of options to address the issue and examine their motivation for its achievement. Many people use this model to focus on issues arising from domestic or professional events beyond their control or maybe just to "seize the day" but the more I explore using coaching techniques within my professional life the more I see no reasons why coaching is not a model worth exploring to attain a better grasp of your faith or a

way of spreading the gospel out to others.

Anything or anyone who wishes to experience growth needs nurture and nourishment. How often do you take the time to encourage your fellow Christians in their faith or even just ask them how it's going ? I'd like to use the written word to work through the GROW model and see if we can't come out of the experience in some way improved.

So join me and think of a goal within your Christian faith. Is there any area you'd like to develop or improve? Mull it over and next time we'll explore achieving our goals in a bit more detail.

Bragg went on to say that he 'really resents' those who do not show respect for a religion which has changed world history. "How dare they?" he asked. "Christians produced magnificent artefacts... they did some marvelous things... I used to be a very strong Christian until I was in my 20s. And that spiritual space, as it were, is still there.
