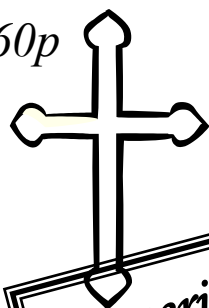

From the Vicarage



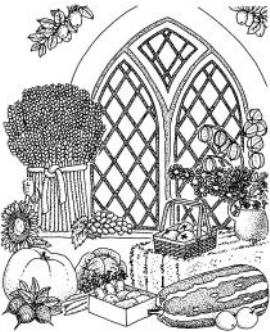
Dear Friends

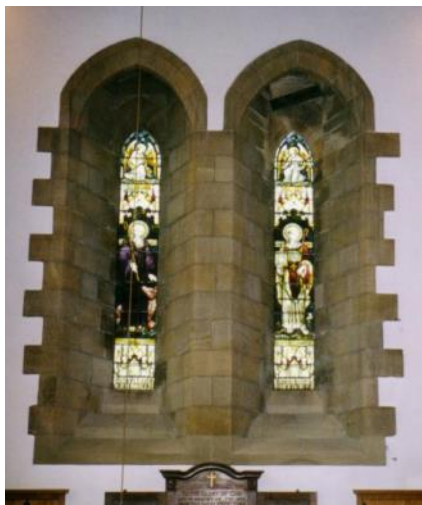
St Giles of Provence

St Giles was an immensely popular saint in the Middle Ages, and no wonder: he was the patron saint of cripples. In those days, there must have been many people who, once injured, were never really whole again. Even today, a serious injury – either physical or mental or emotional, can leave us damaged for months, years or even longer. At such times, we too, find inspiration in others who, though also damaged by life, have not been overwhelmed.

St Giles was probably born in Provence, southern France early in the 7th century. The 10th century *Legenda Aurea* (Golden Legend) tells us he lived as a holy hermit deep in the forest of Nîmes, near the mouth of the Rhone. A hind, or Red Deer, was his only companion. Then one day, while out hunting, King Wamba spotted the deer, and pursued it. The hind fled back to St Giles for protection. King Wamba shot an arrow which missed the deer, but pierced the saint who was protecting it. Thus the king encountered the saint. The saint's acceptance of his injury, and his holiness greatly impressed the king, who conceived a great admiration for St Giles.

In the end, much good came out of the original harm of the encounter, for the king built St Giles a monastery in his valley, Saint-Gilles-du-Gard. The little monastery was put under the Benedictine rule, and became a source of blessing for the area roundabout. In later years, St Giles' shrine would become an important pilgrimage centre on the route for both Compostela and the Holy Land, as well as in its own right.

There is a further story connected with St Giles. Another legend tells how an emperor sought forgiveness from him for a sin so terrible he dared not even confess it. While St Giles said Mass, he saw written for him by an angel the nature of the sin in question. But his prayers for the emperor were so efficacious that the letters naming the sin faded away. As Christians we know that the Bible urges us to pray for others, no matter how hopelessly bad they seem, because Christ's mercy and forgiveness are extended to everyone who truly turns to him and repents.

St Giles, the crippled saint who helped others find wholeness with God, became patron saint of cripples, lepers and nursing mothers. In England 162 ancient churches are dedicated to him, as well as at least 24 hospitals. The most famous of these are St Giles in Edinburgh and St Giles in Cripplegate, London. In art St Giles is represented as either a simple abbot with staff, or protecting the hind, or saying the Mass, and thus interceding for the emperor.

Each year more churches take part and more people come back to church. In 2011 in the Church of England 20 more people came to each church - across all denominations; that's about 77,000 extra people altogether.

And at its heart it is the oldest idea of all, the one that made shepherds leave their flocks, fishermen leave their nets, and tax collectors climb out of trees. Someone invited them!

Of course you can invite your friend to church any Sunday and every Sunday. Come to Harvest can help you take the shortest step in evangelism: inviting someone you know to something you love.

Take a trip to fantasy land

All Saints Church, Daresbury, Warrington or 'The Alice in Wonderland Church'

Set deep in the Cheshire countryside lies the village of Daresbury; only a few minutes from Warrington. It is well known for its connection with Alice in Wonderland and author Lewis Carroll.

At the centre of the village is All Saints Church which was built around 1870. The first stone church was built on the same site around 1550.

Inside this beautiful church are the stained glass Lewis Carroll Memorial Windows, a must for visitors.

The Lewis Carroll Centre is near to the church and both are open all year round from 10am till late.

Lewis Carroll was the pen name of Charles Lutwidge Dodgson who was born on 27 January 1832 in the parish of Daresbury where his father was the perpetual curate. The house where he was born was the parsonage in Morphey Lane, Newton by Daresbury and was a mile and a half from All Saints Church where his father preached on Sundays.

Who was Alice?

Charles met Alice Liddell, daughter of the Dean of Christ Church College Oxford, in 1856 when she was nearly four years old. For sometime she was just one of three sisters he told stories to on trips out. Later as his photography progressed it became obvious that she became his preferred photographic model.

The basis of the story of 'Alice's Adventures in Wonderland' was first told on 4 July 1862, on a boat trip up the Thames from Oxford to Godstow, after which Alice asked Mr Dodgson to write it down for her. After two years it was completed!

By 1865 the story had been expanded and was published as 'Alice's Adventures in Wonderland'.



Alice, the story book one, is shown, along with Lewis Carroll, in the commemorative window in the chapel at All Saints Church. The window was commissioned for the centenary of Lewis Carroll's birth in 1932 but was not installed until 1934. It depicts characters from the Alice books as well as Alice from the story books and Lewis Carroll.

Be a messy gardener



This autumn, don't clean up your garden too much for the winter – leave some messy bits. The Royal Society for the Protection of Birds fears that 'sterile' gardens where nature cannot survive are contributing to the decline in wildlife.

Instead, build 'homes for nature', urges the RSPB: leave some weeds and garden debris, let the grass stay long, don't cut all the nettles, leave the odd log to rot, and cut a hole in your fence for the hedgehogs. You can also fill a bucket with woodchips, soil and rotten branches for insects. Or fill up an old

washing bowl with water and gravel to create a 'mini pond'.

Many celebrity gardeners applaud this approach. Monty Don of the BBC's *Gardener's World* recently tweeted: 'Do not strive after tidiness'. The RSPB campaign is in response to a report that 60 per cent of species in the UK have suffered declines in the past few decades. Our sparrows, starlings, grass snakes, frogs, voles and badgers need our help to breed, move around and survive.

Mike Clarke, chief executive of the RSPB, says: "Nature in the UK is in trouble. Gardens provide a valuable lifeline for species like starlings, toads, hedgehogs and butterflies, which are struggling to find homes in the wider countryside. Although the overall problem is huge, the solution can start on a small scale....Our aim is to provide one million homes for nature across the UK, because if there is no home for nature, then there's no nature – it really is that serious."

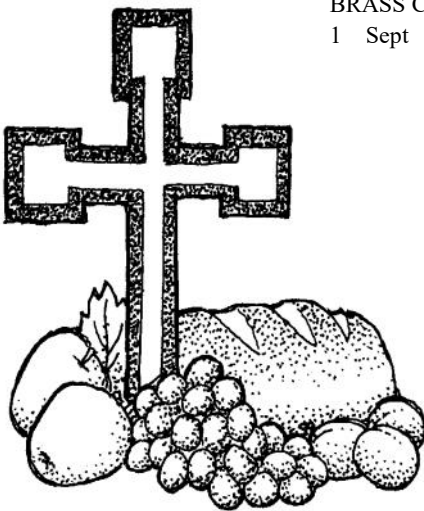
